Craig Courtney in Concert with Northwood Chancel Choir Sunday, March 30, 2025 at 4:00pm


On Sunday, March 30, church music composer Craig Courtney will be presenting a concert with our choir in the afternoon at 4:00pm and will be present in worship service that morning. Mr. Courtney's published works include more than two hundred choral octavos, nine vocal collections, a piano solo collection and six extended works for choir and orchestra. Compositionally, Mr. Courtney combines his training and background as a pianist, a cellist, a vocal coach, an accompanist and a choral director to create words that bear his unique style. We have 40 of his compositions and arrangements on our own shelves and greatly look forward to meeting him in person and delving into the stories behind his songs.

A PRAYER FOR ASH WEDNESDAY (Adapted from Psalm 51)

"Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love. Blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my sins. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Restore me to the joy of your salvation. O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare praises to you. The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit, which God will always accept. Pour out us, O Lord, your mercy, for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.



What's the purpose of Ash Wednesday?

It marks first day of the 40 days of Lent, a roughly six-week period (not including Sundays) dedicated to reflection, prayer and fasting in preparation for Easter. It ends on Holy Thursday, the fifth day of Holy Week (the week leading up to Easter) that marks the Last Supper.

What do the ashes mean?

The ashes, applied in the shape of a cross, are a symbol penance, mourning and mortality.

Good Morning. I am Dee Rivers, and I am an active member of Session, and I serve as the current chair the Membership and Evangelism Team. I would like to take a moment for us to recognize, with gratitude, the service and dedication of Jack and Claudia Alwood. There are hundreds of uses of the verb "to serve" in the New Testament. But the one that most closely resembles service in ministry, or literally "to serve others" is "diakonia". The word and its variations is used more than 30 times in the New Testament alone. It is central to the teaching about the church and its followers. In Luke 22 verse 27, Jesus tells his disciples:

> "For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one who is at the table? But I am among you as one who serves." Jesus' words compel us to be the ones who serve.

Jack and Claudia Alwood have been a wonderful example of God's love and Jesus' heart for service at work here at Northwood. Among other things, they have been invaluable members of the Membership and Evangelism Committee. They have led the Biblical Takeaways Sunday school class, and presented for the Ren Crew. Jack has preached from our pulpit and sung with the choir. Claudia has served as a deacon, shepherd, greeter and usher.

Jack and Claudia, we would like to thank you for teaching, guiding, planning, inspiring, preaching, befriending, singing, and uplifting. 


