#### **Around the Church Campus**

As part of a few prioritized projects for 2024, the gymnasium floor has been stripped of 10 or more years of wax and dirt, lines painted for 2 pickleball courts and basketball 3 point line, waxed, and baseboards installed. It was also painted and closets cleared of years of clutter. Getting through the storms delayed the project a few times but it is complete and looks beautiful.



We thank God that our church made it through 3 storms with manageable damage. Each storm brought different challenges including flooding into the sanctuary and choir room, a large pine tree down across the driveway, shingles blown off the peaked roof and gym roof, tons of tree branches on the property and water blown in at various places on the ceilings. We've been blessed to have a few faithful servants and our scout troops cleaning up after each storm. Their commitment is so appreciated. The SF&P team is getting estimates for the damaged roofs. It appears that a couple of our roofs will need to be replaced. Our insurance policy does not cover the cost for this so we will be working on alternatives for funding the work. We pray that all our members and friends who were impacted are on the road to recovery.

#### **Advent Wreath Lighting**




