## **Hymn of Praise**

Glory in Excelsis (NSB 191)

## The Summary of the Law

#### **The Confession**

Celebrant: Let us confess our sins.

**All**: Merciful God, we have sinned in what we have thought and said, in the wrong we have done and in the good we have not done. We have sinned in ignorance: we have sinned in weakness: we have sinned through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry. We repent and turn to you. Forgive us, for our Saviour Christ's sake, and renew our lives to the glory of your name. Amen.

#### The Absolution

Celebrant: Through the cross of Christ, God have mercy on you, pardon you and set you free. Know that you are forgiven and be at peace. God strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in eternal life.

People: Amen

**Celebrant**: The peace of Christ rule in our hearts.

People: The word of Christ dwell in us richly.




