## Isaiah 6:1–7

- **Isaiah 7:13–14** Then Isaiah said, "Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of humans? Will you try the patience of my God also? <sup>14</sup> Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him <u>Immanuel</u>. (NIV)
- **Isaiah 9:2** The people walking in darkness have seen <u>a great light</u>; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. (NIV)
- Isaiah 9:6–7 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called <u>Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace</u>. <sup>7</sup>Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this. (NIV)
- Wonderful Counselor: Jesus Himself is His own Counselor.
- Mighty God: As this title belongs to God, it belongs to Jesus.
- Everlasting Father: The King who provides for His people and protects them forever.
- Prince of Peace: "Unlike the princes in the pagan pantheon who were always the source of trouble and upheaval, this child will be the source of 'peace,' a biblical concept that includes much more than mere absence of conflict; it speaks of wholeness and integration with no issues left unresolved."
- Jeremiah 23:5 "The days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will raise up for David a <u>righteous Branch</u>, a King who will reign wisely and do what is just and right in the land..." (NIV)
- **Jeremiah 33:15** In those days and at that time I will make <u>a righteous Branch</u> sprout from David's line; he will do what is just and right in the land. (NIV)
- **Zechariah 3:8** Listen, High Priest Joshua, you and your associates seated before you, who are men symbolic of things to come: I am going to bring my servant, <u>the Branch</u>. (NIV)
- **Zechariah 6:12** Tell him this is what the LORD Almighty says: 'Here is the man whose name is <u>the Branch</u>, and he will branch out from his place and build the temple of the LORD...' (NIV)
- **Isaiah 11:2–5** The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him—**the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel** and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD—<sup>3</sup> and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; <sup>4</sup> but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. <sup>5</sup> Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist. (NIV)
