

The Prayer and Boldness of a Leader Who Trusts God Nehemiah 2:1-11

"The remnant there in the province who had survived the exile is in great trouble and shame. The wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates are destroyed by fire." (Nehemiah 1:3 ESV)

"Give success to your servant today, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man." Now I was cupbearer to the king. (Neh. 1:11 ESV)

Nehemiah desires to have a major role in the revival.

A reviving movement among men and women at MeadowBrook is evident. People long for God to move among his people and desperately want to be part of it. Pray: "Do something wonderful and glorious here, Lord, and please, use me!"

People seeking a movement of God ought to seek God for the opportunity to move through them.

God granted Nehemiah's request, empowering him with favor, insight, wisdom, courage, strength, resources, and leadership. By God's grace, the cupbearer became the Persian Empire's appointed governor of Judah.

God would work through Nehemiah, but first, he would need to affect the king's heart, so Nehemiah prayed.

Nehemiah was confident to continue his prayer month after month because it aligned with God's word. He actively waited in prayer and sought the opportunity that God would afford.

King Artaxerxes: "Why is your face sad, seeing that you're not sick?"

His prayer had been, "Give success to your servant today, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man" (Nehemiah 1:11).

With that one simple question, Nehemiah knew God was at work.

Short, rapid prayers are most effective for people committed to deep, authentic praying.

As Nehemiah prayed in his heart, he opened up to the king with his well-thought-out response. "If it pleases the king, and if your servant has found favor in your sight, that you send me to Judah, to the city of my fathers' graves, that I may rebuild it."

His response was clear and concise, and he asked for a decision.

Is there someone in your life who you're praying for God to move upon their heart? Let me encourage you to:

- 1. Pray and fast for God to change their heart.
- 2. Seek his grace to give you the opportunity to make an impact.
- 3. Then watch for the opportunity, seizing it the moment it occurs, not letting fear choke you from uttering the words. In other words, be prepared and ready to speak without delay.

Faith is not negated by good preparation and planning.

The way Nehemiah prepared and planned is a sign of his faith that God would provide the opportunity with the king and ready his heart for what he would ask of him.

Nehemiah's faith and hope were in God alone, not the king. He trusted God to move the heart and mind of the king, and provide as he saw fit. (Proverbs 21:1)

And the king granted me what I asked, for the good hand of my God was upon me. (Nehemiah 2:8 ESV)

Nehemiah knew and understood God's goodness, goodness as his very character. (Psalm 34:8, Psalm 100:5, Psalm 145:9, and James 1:17)

Treasure and trust in the good hand of God.

⁹ Then I came to the governors of the province Beyond the River and gave them the king's letters. Now the king had sent with me officers of the army and horsemen. ¹⁰ But when Sanballat the Horonite and Tobiah the Ammonite servant heard this, it displeased them greatly that someone had come to seek the welfare of the people of Israel. ¹¹ So I went to Jerusalem and was there three days. (Nehemiah 2:1-11 ESV)

We may be right in the center of God's will, walking in his favor, and still experience significant opposition.

We should expect opposition while we continue the redemptive ministry of Christ Jesus, knowing that Christ's victory is already secured.

Expect opposition even as you live and declare the victorious gospel.
