

The Power of a Prayerful Leader, Nehemiah 2:9-20

Review:

The remnant there in the province who had survived the exile was in great trouble and shame. The wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates are destroyed by fire. (Nehemiah 1:3 ESV)

⁹ Then I came to the governors of the province Beyond the River and gave them the king's letters. Now the king had sent with me officers of the army and horsemen. ¹⁰ But when Sanballat the Horonite and Tobiah the Ammonite servant heard this, it displeased them greatly that someone had come to seek the welfare of the people of Israel. ¹¹ So I went to Jerusalem and was there three days. (Nehemiah 2:9-11 ESV)

Local governors, Sanballat and Tobiah, were displeased that someone was seeking the welfare of the Jewish people. Later, Geshem the Arab, joined in the threats against God's people. When Nehemiah called for the people to rebuild the walls, these men strongly opposed them. (Nehemiah 2:19 ESV)

Every Christian must learn to stand courageously and spiritually fight when opposed by enemies who seek to thwart God's will.

How did Nehemiah handle the opposition? He continued as planned and paused for three days of prayer when he arrived in Jerusalem.

The Apostle Paul implores: ¹⁰ Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood. . . (Eph. 6:10-12a ESV) Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. (Ephesians 6:18 ESV)

In Susa, Nehemiah prayed for 4-5 months, seeking God's heart and direction. Upon arriving in Jerusalem, he spent three days praying for steady resolve for him and the people to do God's will.

And later, when the enemies accused Nehemiah of rebelling against the king, he stood his ground. (Nehemiah 2:20)

Standing confidently in God's will, even when we face opposition, comes from kneeling humbly in prayer. In other words, learn to stand confidently by kneeling before God in humility.

Christian leadership is not primarily about charisma, effective communication, appearance, poise, or drive. Genuine and influential Christian leaders are people of prayer—they humbly pray to the Sovereign God, seeking his heart to lead and serve people well.

Nehemiah 2:12-16

After praying, Nehemiah set out to plan, which started with midnight scouting with a few good men. He told no one what God put into his heart to do for Jerusalem (v. 12).

When you believe God has laid something on your heart, test it by asking: "Is my thought in line with what the Bible reveals about God's character and word?" God never contradicts himself or his word, the Bible.

Like Nehemiah, God will be in our decisions if we align our hearts with the Bible.

If you want to make an impact, you'll need to spend time daily with God to align your heart with his and surround yourself with a few good people to help guide your thoughts.

Nehemiah 2:17-18

Christian leaders and influencers serve best when:

- They are empathetic, Spirit-filled problem solvers.
- 2. They are eager to serve alongside others.
- 3. They appeal to the greater rewards, such as honor, dignity, and glory.
- 4. They call people to focus on God, his will, goodness, and grace.

Christians should prayerfully see the world through the eyes of Jesus, be eager to respond to brokenness with his grace, and influence others to join in his work of renewal for his glory and their good.

Our call is to be like Nehemiah, who prayed, sought, and trusted God's goodness and word. He moved in faith to rebuild the brokenness and urged others to join him in restoring the people and city.

What might we see through the Lord's eyes? How will we respond as a church? How will you respond individually? In our obedience, may his glory fill the earth.
