Lessons from Nehemiah: A God-Sent Revival

It is not about the building!

As soon as the last boulder of the wall was placed and the final door was installed in its gate, Nehemiah sent the people home for a few days but asked them to return on the first day of the seventh month. He desired to build in them the eternal truths of God.

Nehemiah understood it would be a travesty to reconstruct and repopulate Jerusalem if the people remained eternally hopeless outside faith in God. He knew that making the city secure and economically viable would be far short of God's desire for them. God wanted an eternal relationship with his people.

God is not primarily focused on our pleasure, prosperity, or popularity. Rather, he is intently focused on our eternal salvation, spiritual growth, and alignment and obedience to his divine will.

Sensing God's mercy and grace to restore Jerusalem, the people were eager for spiritual revival.

See Nehemiah 8:1-3

After working and camping in Jerusalem for 52 days, the people went to their homes for a few days with a request from Nehemiah to return on the first day of Tishri. We can infer that Nehemiah encouraged them to do so with the expectation of reading God's word together.

Life without the Bible:

Never in history have people had more access to the Bible than today. And yet, most are ignorant of its teachings and commands. We must be different. We must not have a superficial understanding of biblical doctrines and the theology of God.

We ought to be reading it, studying it, memorizing it, walking in its truths, and sharing its treasures with others.

We should not expect spiritual transformation or life without God's word, the Bible.

When the people gathered, Ezra, the local scholar of God's law, and 13 Levites read and taught the people.

God's word is the foundation of genuine revival—reading, acknowledging, and responding to the Bible.

Nehemiah 8:5-8

Clearly, the Holy Spirit was working within the people. In this passage, we have five manifestations of congregational worship:

1. Standing

4. Bowing heads

2. Answering "Amen"

5. Bowing in worship with faces to the ground

3. Lifting hands to the Lord

There are other biblical expressions of worship not mentioned in this text, such as singing, clapping, dancing, chanting, and kneeling. We ought to be willing, if not eager, to express to the Lord in a manner biblically modeled and resist the urges outside the purview of the Bible.

Clearly, the people were serious about hearing and responding to God's word. They stood in place for 5-6 hours and were overwhelmed by what they heard and overcome with emotion, mourning, and weeping.

Mourning and weeping is the proper response, for such sorrow moves people to repentance. But on the other side of repentance is joy.

God had expressed his lovingkindness to them when he mercifully and graciously brought them back to the Land, rebuilt the temple, reconstructed the wall, secured the city, and provided selfless leaders who lived for the glory of God and the good of the people.

See Nehemiah 8:9-12

When reading and hearing God's word, we should grieve over our sins and celebrate God's forgiveness.

When the people understood God's forgiveness and goodness, they found his joy, which strengthened them.

Obedience to God's word is a sign of a genuine spiritual revival.

See Nehemiah 8:13-18

The next day, the heads of households returned to study the law more, learning about the Feast of Booths, and they were immediately determined to do it.

The people came to know and understand the goodness of God, and today's text tells us how we can, too.

- They put themselves under the instruction and conviction of God's word.
- They experienced godly grief over their sin and failures, which produced repentance that led to salvation without regret.
- The people trusted God's forgiveness and goodness extended to them, finding the joy of the Lord as their strength.
- They moved quickly to align themselves with God's word.
