

Easter: The Hour Has Come

John 17:1-5

When our Lord speaks of his hour, he refers to the appointed time, the divine predestined moment of the culmination of his earthly ministry, the fulfillment of his purpose, and the ultimate revelation of his glory.

As Jesus walked among mankind, teaching, healing, and proclaiming the kingdom of Heaven, he understood that his ultimate mission had a designated time appointed by the Father, an hour. When he spoke about it, he did so with reverence, anticipation, and unwavering obedience to his Father's will.

Following Jesus' Triumphant Entry, he made a pivotal statement: "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified" (John 12:23).

In John 13-16, during Jesus' Last Supper, he spoke with his disciples about his love, unwavering commitment, and assurance of ultimate victory. He concluded their time with a prayer to his Father.

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, ² since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. ³ And this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. ⁴ I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. ⁵ And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed." (John 17:1-5 ESV)

The hour of glory:

We might define glory as the manifestation of God's greatness, holiness, and majesty. In theological terms, glory is understood as the radiant display of God's attributes. And nowhere or in no one do you find God's glory more ultimately expressed than in the person and work of Jesus Christ.

The hour had come for Jesus to be glorified on the cross (vv. 1, 4).

Not only had Jesus perfectly revealed God's attributes on earth—his greatness, holiness, and majesty—but he also demonstrated them perfectly in love, truth, grace, justice, and power.

All that Jesus did—his life and ministry—expressed and demonstrated the glory of God. The glory of the cross was all that was left for Jesus to accomplish. It was the supreme expression and demonstration of God's nature and purpose.

Jesus reveals God's glory on the cross:

- God's holiness
- God's justice
- God's love (John 3:16-17)

The hour had come for the Father to glorify the Son, giving Jesus the means to bring salvation to those given him to bring glory to the Father in our salvation.

The hour had come for Jesus to be glorified in his resurrection and heaven (v. 5).

Over again, Jesus made statements like Mark 9:31. "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And when he is killed, after three days he will rise." (ESV)

In every gospel account—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John—Jesus made definitive statements about his death and confident statements about his resurrection, both of which are necessary for our salvation. However, in the Lord's prayer of John 17, he looks beyond the cross and resurrection, seeking the Father's glory in heaven as before Christ's incarnation.

We should always remember and praise the Lord Jesus for redeeming and saving us. Yet, we must not envision him on the cross or in the tomb. Rather, we must worship him in his exalted position at the right hand of God the Father in power and glory.

The hour has come for Jesus to be glorified in his church (vv. 2-3, 10).

[Glorify your Son] ² since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. ³ And this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. ¹⁰ All mine are yours, and yours are mine, and I am glorified in them. (John 17:2-3, 10 ESV)

The glory of Christ can now be seen in us, his church.

According to God's eternal plan of salvation, the Father gave Jesus authority over all flesh to grant eternal life to all entrusted to him, which was made possible through the cross.

The fact that Christ saves us from sin and death, declares us righteous, and grants us eternal life in heaven glorifies him, for he alone was given authority to bring it about.

Eternal life comes from knowing the only true God and Jesus Christ. Knowing God is more than being insightful about him; it is a deep, intimate knowledge that comes from a close relationship with Jesus Christ, God in flesh.

"And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12 ESV)

In accordance with his prayer, every time someone comes to the knowledge and faith of God for salvation, Jesus is glorified and continues to be when Christians pursue knowledge of him.

In addition to the events mentioned in the handout, we invite you to return next Sunday for our 9:00 AM worship service and to Coffee Hour following the morning service on April 21 at


Café '59. It will be my honor to get to know you and share more about the church while enjoying a cup of coffee and a pastry. Our treat!
