

## **Transformed Living, Part Two**

Nehemiah 9:32-10:39

#### Recap

The people knew they had transgressed the covenant and that their hope could not be in themselves. Their only hope was a gracious God who would keep his promises and remember them in their affliction. This hopeful faith—*like faith always does*—moved them to action.

After their prayer which recounted God's covenant faithfulness despite their covenantal unfaithfulness and which asked the Lord to remember them in their trials, the people publicly made a firm, but provisional covenant with the Lord to live transformed in response to what the Spirit had done in their midst.

The Spirit's revival brings about renewal and a transformed way of living by captivating us with the beauty of Christ, reforming our beliefs, and strengthening our wills weakened by the flesh.

After entering into this covenant with the Lord, the first specific commitment made by the people had to do with protecting the sanctity of the household.

# The Spirit works through godly households connected to the community of faith to build up the next generation.

*To the unmarried in the room:* 

- Singleness does not render you a second-class citizen in God's Kingdom. (cf. Matt 19:12)
- You do not need marriage to flourish in this life or ministry. (i.e. Jesus, Paul, Augustine, etc.)
- Regardless of what God has in store for your future, leverage your singleness for the glory of God (cf. 1 Cor 7:32—35)

The family is meant to reflect the Kingdom of God. (cf. John 1:12–13, Eph 5:31–32, Matt 12:50, Col 1:15, Eph 6:1–3)

"The family will correspond to its design to the extent that it constitutes a Kingdom of God in miniature. For the Kingdom of God does not exist for the sake of the family, but, as is true of everything else, the family exists for the sake of the Kingdom of God. . . . The relationships of family life have their reflection and standard in that communal life of a much higher order, found in the Kingdom of God." — Herman Bavinck (AD 1854 — 1921)

Godly households that are connected to the broader community of faith—the local church—are one of the chief means through which the Spirit transmits the gospel from one generation to the next.

We will not give our daughters to the peoples of the land or take their daughters for our sons. (Nehemiah 10:30 ESV)

The charge not to intermarry with surrounding peoples had nothing to do with differences in the pigment of their skin. The concern was religious, not racial. The surrounding peoples worshiped idols, and to intermarry with them would compromise the faith environment of the home. (cf. 2 Cor 6:14)

*To the unmarried who desire to marry:* 

- Pursue purity.
- Pursue contentment.
- Pursue someone who encourages you in the faith and brings you joy.

#### Cultivate a home environment that promotes true worship.

- 1. Parent with the end in mind. (cf. 2 Cor 3:18)
- 2. Shepherd the heart in love and patience. (cf. Jas 1:19–20; Col 3:21)
- 3. Keep the conversation open. Talk with your children about the Bible and answer their questions. (cf. Deut 6:4—7)
- 4. Pray for and with your children. (cf. 1 Chron 29:18–19)
- 5. Openly put the idols of your past away. (cf. Josh 24:14–15)
- 6. Make corporate worship a priority. (Neh 10:31)


The OT Sabbath applies a principle of creation, 6 days of work + 1 day of rest, in its unique covenantal context that is taken up and fulfilled in Christ, who is our perpetual Sabbath and who secured for us the eternal Sabbath rest. Nevertheless, we still submit to the same creational principle in a distinctly New Covenant context through our Lord's Day worship as we rest from our worldly concerns and celebrate what has been accomplished by Christ.

Keep in Mind: Our practices regarding corporate worship on the Lord's Day proclaim to our households the God or gods we worship.
