

Lessons from Nehemiah: Being a Constant Reformer

Nehemiah 13:1-31, part 2

See Nehemiah 13:15-22

Nehemiah confronted profaning the Sabbath:

Consider what the passage does not teach.

Nehemiah 13 does prohibit Christians from buying fish, grain, or goods on the Sabbath. Although the rhythm of six days of work and one day of rest is excellent, we are not required to keep the law. (See Colossians 2:16-17 and Romans 14:5-6)

Passage principles to consider:

Use righteous anger to your advantage and for the advancement of the kingdom of God.

A case study of the UMC:

"When God's people cease to be on watch against the world, they are already in its grip, and continuous weakening is all that can be expected as long as this negligence lasts." (J. I. Packer)

Worldliness is a constant threat to Christ's church. We must unabashedly conserve biblical truth and practice.

It is not good enough to merely hold to biblical values; we must conserve them, passing them down generationally.

See Malachi 3:6a, Psalm 119:89, and Hebrews 13:7-9

Nehemiah called for marriage and family reforms:

See Nehemiah 13:23-31

Nehemiah noted intermarriage with women of Ashdod, Ammon, and Moab. Half of their children couldn't even speak Hebrew, making it impossible for them to hear and understand the teachings of the Bible.

Nehemiah's response may seem harsh. He confronted the sinful husbands, cursed them, beat some, and pulled out their hair. I agree, but it is light compared to God's crushing judgment when he exercises his holy wrath against people who reject him and rebel against his law.

See Hebrews 10:26-27, 29 and Matthew 25:41

Marriage is meant to draw us nearer to Christ, and according to Ephesians 5, our holy unions are to illustrate the gospel of Christ. Therefore, the Christian church must protect the biblical institution, uphold its definition, conserve its value, and bear its witness.

- We must not be unequally yoked in our marriages. (2 Corinthians 6:14)
- We must not agree with unbiblical divorces. (Genesis 2, Matthew 19, and Malachi 2:16)
- We must not allow unholy fornication. (1 Corinthians 6:9-20)

Fornication (porneia) is the term the Bible uses for sexual misconduct or sexual activity occurring outside the boundary of marriage. Throughout the scripture, the sins of idolatry and apostasy are spoken of in terms of fornication.

Fornication doesn't belong with our new nature and identity in Christ Jesus. "Your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God. You are not your own" (6:19).

Churches will always need courageous and bold leaders to face wrongs head-on.

Leaders must understand the significance and severity of sin, not allowing it to linger.

Not only must sin be pointed out, we must correct it and seek ways to guard against it.

Nehemiah is the last historical record until the coming of John the Baptist. The book leaves us longing for someone greater than him to bring lasting transformation. It leaves us longing for Jesus, the Messiah.
