Annual Congregational Meeting

June 3/4, 2023

Minutes

Calvary Lutheran Church and School

- 1. This year's meeting was held in two onsite sessions: one session after the 5:30 PM worship service on Saturday, June 3, 2023, and one session after the 10:45 AM worship service on Sunday, June 4, 2023. The meeting was recessed between the two sessions.
- 2. On Saturday, June 3, the meeting was called to order at 6:49 PM and conducted by Bill Laut, Executive Director. Bill explained the process of having the meeting in two sessions. There were 33 voting members in attendance. On Sunday, June 4, the meeting was reconvened at approximately 11:58 AM by Bill Laut, Executive Director. There were 48 voting members in attendance. Total voting members in attendance across the two sessions was 81, meaning that a quorum was present.
 - a. Bill reviewed the agenda. The agenda for each session was the same. (See Attachment 1.)
 - b. Attachment 2 contains the slides that were presented at both sessions of this meeting. Please refer to these slides for details of what was presented.
 - c. Steve Rensner opened both sessions with prayer.
 - d. Bill Laut reviewed the minutes from the prior year's voters meeting (2022). (See Attachment 3.) There was a **MOTION** and second to approve the minutes from our last congregational meeting held June 4/5, 2022. The motion **CARRIED** at both sessions.
 - e. Bill mentioned that Mrs. Jennifer Weaver accepted the preschool teacher Call.
 - f. Andrew Brock gave the Financial Report for the third fiscal quarter ended April 30, 2023. (See Attachment 2 for details.)
 - i. This is year to date for 9 months ending April 2023. On the Balance Sheet, Assets and Liabilities, total cash is up approximately \$34,000, investments are down about \$110,000. Net assets are down about \$63,000.
 - ii. For Revenue and Expenses, 9 months through April 2023, revenue was \$2.38M vs a budget of \$2.32M. Expenses were \$2.03M vs a budget of \$2.07M. YTD Net is a surplus of just over \$349,000, about \$100,000 better than budget.
 - iii. Andrew Brock then presented the 2023-2024 budget.
 - Andrew noted that the projected contributions are down slightly from current year, but with an increase in Tuition we are projecting total revenues at \$2.968M, up 6% over current year's estimate.

Total expenses are projected to be \$3.022M, vs a \$2.690M estimate for our current year. Most expenses are up due to inflation, and it was noted that we are increasing the maintenance budget a little to support necessary maintenance for our facilities.

Net for the 2023-2024 budget is \$53,619 loss. It was pointed out that this is a small percentage of an approximately \$3M budget. Also, the General Funds surplus estimate for the current year is \$735,000, so even with a light budgeted loss, we expect the General Fund surplus to still be at \$682,000 at the end of next year.

- iv. Bill Laut noted that Executive Committee and Parish Council have both recommended this budget There was a **MOTION** and second to approve the 2023-2024 Congregational Budget as presented. The motion **CARRIED** at both sessions.
- g. Facilities update: Pastor Ebert explained that he has been chairing the Facilities meetings due to the director vacancy.
 - i. The current Sanctuary lighting system is old and frail. The Sanctuary lighting project will replace all lights and wiring, and is starting Tuesday, June 6. Will be worshipping in the Gym during this time and plan to return to the Sanctuary for the July 15/16 worship services.
 - ii. The team is focusing on preparing the Gym for worship during the project. The air conditioning and sound system have been checked and are working. Note that the Gym will be cleared for VBS June 19-23.
 - iii. Jr. High classrooms will be renovated June 12-30. (Paint, LED lighting, flooring as needed)
 - iv. July 5-12 we will be sealing and striping the North parking lot.
 - v. Summer carpet and tile cleaning is planned.
 - vi. We are looking at improvements in the Narthex/Lobby.
 - vii. Pastor asked for assistance for clearing out the Sanctuary and setting up the Gym, as well as the June 17 school lighting workday. Other opportunities will be available.
- h. Pastor Ebert presented that Brian Krohmer is being welcomed soon as our new Youth DCE. We are excited to be mentoring a new church worker.
- i. Bill Laut discussed that the Sanctuary is 26 years old the carpeting, the chairs, etc. We need to keep things maintained and updated. Based on our current financial situation, we now have the opportunity to fix some things that we have been putting off.
- j. Kyle Allen presented the efforts of the Executive Committee and Parish Council to complete a strategic plan.
 - i. A survey resource from Synod was utilized. Kyle thanked everyone in the congregation who participated. See the results slides in Attachment

- 2. We ended up on the border of quadrants 2 and 3; in "Stasis." This is ok, but we have opportunities to move back to quadrant 2 in the Prime area, and to keep us from going down the curve towards Termination. Opportunities are in the areas of community, hospitality, and adaptability. These results were all positive.
- ii. Next came planning by the Parish Council and ministry teams. We did not redo our mission (Engaging People in Christ) and vision (connecting, learning, caring, and serving), but rather did the exercises in context of these. The steps were Provision Exercise, SWOT analysis, and SMART goal setting. This summer we will be reviewing and finalizing the SMART goals. These will then be presented.
- iii. Kyle thanked everyone who participated in the process to date.
- iv. Kyle ended with Jeremiah 29:11-13:

 For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.
- v. Bill Laut summarized why we are completing this strategic plan. There will be a separate meeting in the future to present this in more detail to the congregation.

k. School update: Steve Rensner

- i. Ruth Armao has retired; Mrs. Jennifer Weaver has accepted Calvary's Call as Preschool Teacher.
- ii. Staffing is pretty well set; a part-time preschool aide is still needed.
- iii. When the school first was established, 90% of the students were members from member families; That percentage is now 25%.
- iv. We ended this school year with 225 students; next year's enrollment will be about 265! This has resulted in additional double classes in grades 4, 5, and 6. Part of this increased enrollment is due to Southport Christian School closing and many of the families deciding to send their students to Calvary.
- v. SGOs are no longer needed as a steppingstone to a Choice Scholarship, as that requirement has been removed. However, SGOs can now be used for preschool so we will continue to use them. We anticipate a need of about \$55,000 for the next school year.
- vi. In the area of school safety, we ran an extensive intrusion drill on April 4 with the participation of local law enforcement, and results are being analyzed.
- vii. Volunteers are needed at 3:00 on Wednesday, June 7 to pick up furniture from Southport Christian School.

- viii. Calvary's 73rd class graduated on May 25th. There were twenty-seven 8th graders who graduated.
- Pastor Ebert presented the Nominations Slate of Officers and Ministry Teams for 2023-2024. (See Attachment 4.) He acknowledged and thanked those who are willing to serve, as well as the nominating committee of Pastor Kurt Ebert, Deaconess Emily Spelde, Director of Connections and Engagement Kara Hiatt, Wade Jackson, Tia Kochan, Susan Richert. There was a MOTION and second to accept the slate. The motion CARRIED in both sessions. There was then a MOTION and second to elect the nominees listed on the 2023-2024 Nominations Slate. The motion CARRIED at both sessions.
- m. Bill Laut presented that Pastor Reifsteck has requested a peaceful release from his Call at Calvary. There was a **MOTION** and second that we grant Pastor Joshua Reifsteck a peaceful release. The motion **CARRIED** at both sessions.
- n. Saturday: There was a **MOTION** and second to recess until tomorrow. The motion **CARRIED**.
 - Sunday: There was a **MOTION** and second to adjourn. The motion **CARRIED**.
- o. Pastor Ebert closed the meeting with prayer.
- p. Saturday: The meeting recessed at 7:29 PM. Sunday: The meeting adjourned at 12:39 PM.

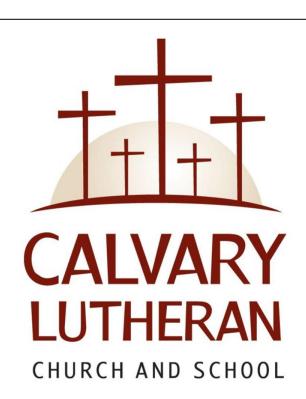

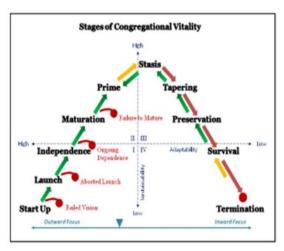

Example Stage of Vitality based on Survey





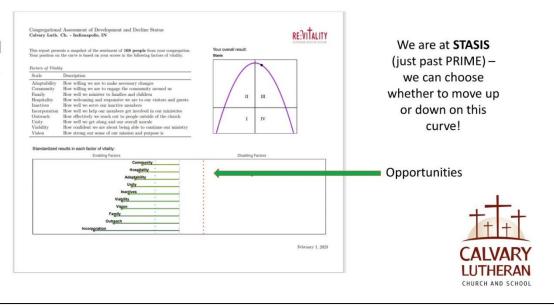




Strategic Planning Survey Results - Calvary 2023

- 4. On Saturday, June 4, the meeting was called to order at 7:40 PM and conducted by Gene Jend, Executive Director. There were 39 voting members in attendance. On Sunday, June 5, the meeting was reconvened at approximately 12:10 PM by Gene Jend, Executive Director. There were 47 voting members in attendance. Total voting members in attendance was 86, meaning we had a quorum.
 - a. The agenda for each session was the same. (See Attachment 1.)
 - b. Attachment 1 contains the slides that were presented at this meeting. Please refer to them for details of what was presented.
 - c. Executive Director Gene Jend opened with a devotion and prayer.
 - d. Gene Jend welcomed the attendees and gave some opening comments. He noted that anyone 18 years old and older and a member of the congregation could vote. A quorum is 5% of membership, which is 53 voting members.
 - e. Gene Jend presented some recent Highs and Lows from the 2021-2022 church year.
 - f. Gene Jend reviewed the minutes from the prior year's voters meeting (2021). (See Attachment 2.) There was a **MOTION** and second to approve the minutes from our last congregational meeting held June 5/6, 2021. The motion **CARRIED** at both sessions.
 - g. There was a question as to whether we needed to have new motions at the second session since motions were made at the first session on Saturday night. It was stated that we should have new motions at the second session.
 - h. Gene Jend presented the Nominations Slate of Officers and Ministry Teams for 2022-2023. (See Attachment 3.) He acknowledged and thanked those who are willing to serve, as well as the nominating committee of Pastor Ebert, Deaconess Emily Spelde, Director of Engagement Kara Hiatt, Susan Richert, Wade Jackson, and Director of Admissions & Development Jennifer Skojac. There was a **MOTION** and second to elect the nominees listed on the 2022-2023 Nominations Slate. Gene noted that we aim to elect 1/3 of the ministry team directors each year. The motion **CARRIED** at both sessions.
 - i. Pastor Ebert presented the congregational update.

- iv. We will be asking if we desire the calling to make sure there is a place for our children and grandchildren, for our nieces and nephews a church that cares for and meets our loved ones and neighbors where they are at and welcomes them into God's kingdom.
- v. Are we comfortable with change for the good of others?

Thank you Gene Jend

Pastor Ebert thanked Gene Jend for his four years of service as our Executive Director. The attendees acknowledged Gene with a round of applause.

- j. Principal Steve Rensner gave an update on the school.
 - i. At Saturday's session Steve brought Bailey, Calvary's Comfort Dog, with him.
 - ii. Calvary has received almost \$500,000 in EANS I and EANS II funds Emergency Aid for Non-public Schools. This has allowed us to take a lot of our plans, strategies, and hopes, and incorporate them into our ministry.
 - The EANS I spending was focused on infrastructure and foundation. EANS II monies were focused on serving the underserved. This includes staffing, programming, and curriculum. Examples are a STEM instructor and curriculum coach.
 - iii. Steve thanked the teaching staff for their tremendous efforts during the pandemic.
 - iv. At the Saturday session, there was a question on security for the school. Steve reported that we run drills and tests for the children and staff. We also have installed new locks on the classroom doors. There is an emergency/silent alarm button in the school office to summon first responders. Steve attends the school safety academy each year.
 - v. At the Saturday session, there was a question on whether we were able to use the EANS funds to improve our connectivity to the Internet. The answer was

yes, including internal network improvements, teacher laptops, student Chromebooks, and faster Internet service.

- k. Fellowship Director Diane Robinson shared about her team. They have focused on the challenge of keeping people connected during the pandemic and are well positioned to support our upcoming church ministry year theme. Diane shared what her team does, how they do it, and others can be a part of it.
- 1. Gene Jend gave a report on the new Director of Admissions & Development position, which was instituted for the current church year. Successes included participation and record results for our Calvary Walk | Run | Ride event and our Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) fundraising.
- m. Andrew Brock gave the Financial Report for the third fiscal quarter ended April 30, 2022. (See Attachment 1 for details.)
 - i. We are above budget on revenue and below budget on expense another successful year. Revenue was \$2.16 million, and expenses were \$1.9 million. Net gain of almost \$240,000. The cumulative general fund balance ended at \$913,119.
 - ii. We continue to have no debt. We are very blessed as many other non-profit organizations are not as fortunate as we are. The PPP loan was reported as debt last year as it was officially a loan at that time; as we expected, it has been converted into a grant.
 - iii. Endowments ended this fiscal quarter at \$1.15 million vs. \$1.17 million last year at this time. The stock market this year has impacted this total.
 - iv. Extraordinary Revenue to date totals \$696,000. This started as a protection during the pandemic, but since the congregation stepped up, it became an unplanned blessing to us. Andrew detailed our plans and spending to date. See Attachment 1 for details.

At the Sunday session, there was a question regarding how much we are contributing to the Synod for mission programs. It was stated that our contribution to Synod has not changed over the past several years. It was later noted that our contribution to Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod Indiana District is \$10,000 per year.

n. Andrew Brock presented the proposed 2022-2023 budget.

We are budgeting a surplus of \$63,851 for the year and are budgeting to end the year with a Cumulative General Fund surplus of \$399,416. Note that the cumulative balance decreases as extraordinary expenses are taken out of the General Fund and allocated to other funds.

Andrew reviewed some information on the Salaries & Benefits account of the proposed budget. He explained that we are now using the Concordia Plans Compensation Decision Support Tool as our Indiana District is no longer publishing its salary scale. Calvary salaries are based on 100% of midpoint of this new tool.

There was a **MOTION** and second to approve the 2022-2023 Congregational Budget as presented. The motion **CARRIED** at both sessions.

- o. Gene Jend gave an update on the Paving the Way special appeal. Current projects include a new school dishwasher and repaving the south parking lot. Other projects being considered are the Sanctuary and Narthex carpeting, the Sanctuary lights, and restroom remodeling.
- 5. On Saturday, June 4, 2022, there was a motion to recess the meeting until Sunday; the session was recessed at 8:15 PM. On Sunday, June 5, 2022, there was a motion to adjourn the meeting; the meeting was adjourned at 1:11 PM.
- 6. The meeting was closed with everyone reading 1Corinthians 9:23: I do it all for the sake of the gospel, that I may share with them in its blessings.
