### From the Pastors Seeking God's Guidance and Will

"Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long" (Psalm 25:5).

We desire to follow God's plans for us. We desire to see His will be done among us, but how do we go about discerning God's will? How do we know where God is leading?

Many desire that the process would be as easy as hearing the voice of the Lord or receiving a clear sign/message from God. We would even settle for God sending us an email everyone once in a while letting us know that we are on the right track. The problem is that seeking God's will is not magical, mysterious, or even miraculous. God has given us both His Word and His wisdom. He has given us our physical/creational gifts of "body and soul, eyes, ears, and all [our] members, [our] reason and all [our] senses" (Small Catechism, The Creed, 1<sup>st</sup> Article) and He has given us our spiritual gifts in Christ Jesus as "the Holy Spirit has called [us] by the Gospel, enlightened [us] with His gifts, and kept [us] in the true faith" (Small Catechism, The Creed, 3<sup>rd</sup> Article). As the Apostle Paul reminded the Christians in Corinth, "...in every way you were enriched in [Jesus] in all speech and all knowledge ... so that you are not lacking in any gift, as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 1:5, 7).

God has plans for us individually and collectively. God has gifted us individually and collectively. God has called us to be about following His will as we joyously respond to the goodness and grace that is ours in Christ Jesus our Lord. And for that very reason, the people of Calvary continue to seek God's will for us. We do it looking to His Holy Scriptures that provide us both His truth and His grace for our daily lives and also by using our 1<sup>st</sup> article gifts of human wisdom, leadership, collaboration, and reflection, as well as His 3<sup>rd</sup> article gifts of prayer, reflection, and the mutual conversation and consolation of Christian brothers and sisters.

There are two exciting opportunities taking place at Calvary, as we seek God's will among us. First, a **call committee** has been formed to seek God's will in filling our role of Associate Pastor of Pastoral Care and Adult Education. Members include Phil Hendershott (chair), Ann Arnold, Gene Jend, Rhonda Hansen, Ben Langhammer, Kirsten Springer, and Wendy Wilson. Ex Officio members are Pastor Kurt Ebert, Pastor Sam Troemel, Bill Laut (Exec. Dir.), and Eric Eisberg (Spiritual Care Dir.). We have scheduled our first meeting with our Indiana district representatives, who will provide guidance to our Call Committee as it accomplishes its work. We ask for your prayers for the work of the Call Committee, that the Holy Spirit may guide this process. Please continue to stay informed and connected to this process as we seek God's will for our congregation.

Second, our **Strategic Planning Process** that started at the end of 2022 has reached a new stage in the process. After a continued process of reflection, discussion, and engagement of many leaders and volunteers among our congregation, we have reached 3 clearly established goals that we will be working toward during this ministry year. They are meant to help unite us in a common direction. They will allow us to improve the ministry here at Calvary, while also situating us to reach out to our neighborhood and community. Again, we ask for your prayers, your support, and your engagement. ### From Your Executive Director

As I write this November's article, it's nearing the middle of October, and we've already had a taste of fall with some brisk mornings. Those who know me well also know I don't do well with Autumn: I am a Spring and Summer person. While some may rave about the fall colors and the crisp weather, this is not my season. I think it goes back to my grandparents' cottage on Lake Lemon, where I spent my summers growing up; the falling leaves and cool weather were a reminder that summer was over. No more boating, swimming, fishing, or finding new expeditions.

The weather has become an obsession with some Americans: we have The Weather Channel, Accuweather, Weather Underground, and many other sources for 24/7 coverage and discussion about the weather. We are alerted to unfavorable weather days in advance and given plenty of time to take precautions if needed. Those of us old enough to remember the Palm Sunday tornados in 1965 did not have that luxury; I remember leaving my cousin's confirmation at Calvary that Sunday only to be rushed home and hunker down in the basement the remainder of the day.

Humorist (and curmudgeon) Mark Twain, in his book *The Gilded Age*, quipped "Everybody talks about the weather but nobody does anything about it." I work in an office where nobody can agree on what the office temperature can be – I cannot imagine the disagreements over what the weather should be.

We can't change the weather, but we can change how we at Calvary share Christ's Gospel message with our members and our community, as we Engage People in Christ.

We need to find better ways to <u>Learn</u> and grow as Christians, and to also understand our Lutheran heritage. Do you have a copy of the Book of Concord in your home, to know what we as Lutheran Christians hold to be our common confession and beliefs?

We must seek to better <u>Connect</u> with our members and community. We are blessed with a robust online presence and the ability to share our service with those unable to attend. Did you know that according to a recent study, about 30% of Americans now work on the weekends, meaning they may be unable to attend worship services in person? We need to be able to reach those people in a consistent manner.

We should always seek to improve how we <u>Care</u> for others who are in need or may be less fortunate: the single mother. The unemployed. Those with health issues. Those who have allowed pride and human arrogance to stand between them and Christ. Are we helping these, as we are told to do by Christ in Matthew 22:39 and in John 13:34?

All these things we do, or ought to do, are done in love, <u>Serving</u> Christ. Might they require changes on our part? Are we willing to make those changes to better serve as an example of His love for us and others? Or will we just say "Meh, the status quo is okay. Let's not do anything differently"?

We have a mission and vision as members of Christ's church at Calvary Lutheran. I pray that during this month, a month connected to Thanksgiving, we remember and are thankful for the many blessings He has given us, and we in turn take these to others.

#### <u>Interest</u>

I always found financial interest to be fascinating. As a child, I was taught the advantages and disadvantages of interest placed financial accounts. Of course, the advantage is that when funds are invested, the investor receives interest on their initial deposit. The obvious disadvantage is that when money is borrowed a larger percentage of interest is assessed. We never get more interest depositing than when accessed interest borrowing. Today's interest rates make purchasing items more costly if requiring borrowing funds. Does this concept of interest apply to our relationships with one another and with God? We do indeed invest in one another. At Calvary Lutheran this occurs each hour of each day. Teaching and instruction are invested into the hearts and minds of the students. God invests His love in us through His Word and the power of the Holy Spirit. We would be bankrupt without this saving and redeeming love. God's interest is eternal. No term limits. God calls us to share His love without limits as well. When we invest in and with one another all benefit. We all gain a return in building this community and partnership. #### **Opening Doors**

God has blessed families of Indiana with the choice of sending their children to the school that they feel best meets their needs. The LUTHERAN SGO of Indiana has changed the boundaries of the local school and greatly broadened them. You can open even more doors allowing students to enter the hallways of Calvary Lutheran Church and School. This opportunity will provide scholarship grants to students and their families. Contributions made by you for this purpose will be used to offer a Christian education so that children may not only receive a quality education, but to hear God's Word.

How do I help open these doors? Contribution forms for Lutheran SGO are available online at <u>www.LutheranSGO.org</u>. The state of Indiana will give you a tax credit of 50% of your donation. Example: If you give a gift of \$1000.00 you will receive an Indiana state tax credit of \$500.00. This is a unique opportunity. Funding for these scholarship grants for current students enrolled at Calvary is \$45,500.00. We have currently gathered approximately \$17,000.00. Those desiring to contribute to this fund may do so through December 31 to receive the tax credit for this 2023 calendar year. Any additional funds gathered will remain in our account with the Lutheran SGO of Indiana to be used during the 2024-25 school year. We ask the Lord to provide for the needs of others through the gifts of our hands.

#### National Lutheran Schools Accreditation

The faculty, staff, and parents of Calvary Lutheran School have been engaged in a yearlong self-study process. This process culminates in a 3-day site visit by 6 Lutheran educators. This visit is scheduled for November 8-10. The visiting team observes our daily activities and programs. Standards are checked and ratified. Our self-study report presents evidence to support our execution of those standards. We thank all of them for their work and care throughout this process. We thank the six Lutheran educators for their time and willingness to serve on this visiting team. The result of the self-study process is to create a 5-year plan setting goals and objectives. We ask the Lord to guide us according to His Good Will.



# Stewardship Emphasis

### Student Scholarship Needs - Scholarship Granting Organization

God provides a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana is a Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO). Scholarships through private and corporate donations are available to Calvary student families whose income is less certain Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

Gifts received will be used to fund SGO Scholarships for Calvary Students for the coming school year. The needed SGO Scholarship funds this year are over \$45,000 to fully fund scholarships for all eligible recipients.

### Too Good To Be True?! A 50% TAX CREDIT for Indiana State tax liabilities!

The SGO donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated.

Example: A donation of \$1,000 will result in a state tax credit of \$500. towards your Indiana income tax liability. Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit. Please check with your tax preparer if a Federal Tax deduction is available.

To receive tax benefits for the current year please donate by December 31. The donor form and steps are located online at www.LutheranSGO.org. Be sure to identify CALVARY LUTHERAN, INDIANAPOLIS as the recipient of your gift.

## **Extravagant Sharing**


