From the Pastors

The Passing of Time

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..." (Ecclesiastes 3:1).

"...the appointed time has grown very short. ...

For the present form of this world is passing away" (1 Corinthians 7:29, 31).

When we are young, we do not think of the precious commodity of time. We think that we have stores and stores of it. We believe that an endless supply simply awaits.

Why do we think this? Because too often life seems to move so "slowly" when we are young. There is always something that we anxiously await. It seems like our next birthday or our next holiday or our next school break will never get here. It seems like we are always impatiently waiting for the day that we will finally be old enough to have our own bedroom or tall enough for the big kid bike or mature enough for the next thing our parents don't think we are ready for yet. When we are young, we can find ourselves too frequently wishing away the time that we have because of something that we don't yet have.

And yet as we age, we find ourselves having quite the opposite experience. We long for the days that have passed. We yearn for days that were simpler, happier, or better. We wish for the time when our health was better, our kids were younger, or our days were fuller.

Time can be a funny thing. We can too often try to live in the future or dwell in the past, causing us to fail to cherish the present. After all, the "present" is the very "gift" that God continues to give. Ecclesiastes 3 reminds us that there are certain seasons through which we must pass. It reminds us in its own sing-song way that life in this world is never "stagnant." There are changes that must be navigated, transitions that must be embraced, blessings that must be received, and losses that must be mourned. Though we may long for another time and space, it is only within that specific season that we are presently placed. And it is within that particular season that we must ask, "In light of God's presence and promises to me in this present time, how shall I live?"

We do not want to waste what wisdom God wants to impart. We do not want to squander the gifts that have been given. We especially do not want to miss the window to see God's will at work within our lives. A preacher by the name of Charles Spurgeon once reflected upon our topic in this way, "Time is short. Eternity is long. It is only reasonable that this short life be lived in the light of eternity." So, where is God inviting you to life in the light of eternity? Where is God inviting you to see His blessings, to hear His calling, and to touch His presence in the blessings of the "PRESENT"?

May our God give you the assurance that "the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is [His] faithfulness. ... The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him. It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord" (Lamentations 3:22-26). Let us therefore wait for the Lord in the present and receive what He shall bless us with from His gracious hand. And as we wait, we praise, we thank, we confess, we pray, for He is the one who is with us in every moment. Although you may not feel it, although you may not think it, and although at times you may not believe it, there is never a moment that He is not right there beside you. There is never a moment that you are alone.

- 5. Used orthopedic braces and splints are also accepted.

Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

When we talk about special days in February, the first response from most people will be "Valentine's Day" on February 14th, followed by President's Day, a floating holiday celebrated this year on the 19th. Those of us over 50 probably remember when we celebrated Lincoln's Birthday (the 12th) and Washington's Birthday (the 22nd, N.S.) as separate events. The Uniform Monday Holiday Act passed by Congress in 1968 officially changed our celebratory date, which previously had always been on Washington's Birthday.

Honoring both Washington and Lincoln has a long history in our country. Many of us learned the line "First in war, first in peace, and first in the hearts of his countrymen" written as a eulogy for Washington by General Henry "Light Horse Harry" Lee. And we likely recall reading what Secretary of State Edwin Stanton said after Lincoln breathed his last: "Now he belongs to the ages."

There are two other very important dates we Lutherans commemorate in February: February 16th, the birth of Philip Melanchton, and February 18th, the death of Martin Luther. Both of these men played nearly the same role as Washington and Lincoln: like Washington, Luther was the father of the Reformation, and like Lincoln, Melanchthon's writings helped hold the early Lutheran church together.

We are not the Rome church, which has over 10,000 recognized saints, many forgotten by time. But we do give certain people like Luther and Melanchthon, special recognition and commemoration in the church. In Article XXI of the Augsburg Confession, largely written by Melanchthon, we read: "(We) teach that the memory of saints may be set before us, that we may follow their faith and good works, according to our calling." In other words, we honor the saints, not as intercessors to God, but as a source of inspiration for our own life and faith.

At Calvary, we also give honor to saints, those who came before us and served as examples of Christian faith to us. Perhaps it was a certain pastor or adult leader. Maybe a grandparent, or a close family friend. It might even be someone we only know from a distance, whose life has shown outward evidence of their internal faith. We are blessed, as a congregation, to come from a long line of saints.

Yet how do we honor and follow their faith? How do we provide an example to others, both inside and outside our church? How do we connect with others to share the Gospel? How do we demonstrate our care and our love for others? And how do we grow and learn in the Word? Do we accomplish these things by sitting back and letting others do the work, or do we actively involve ourselves in the work of the church, helping others to grow in their faith? Or even understand who Jesus is, and why we work to spread His Gospel?

And while we commemorate and remember both Luther and Melanchthon, we need to remember these men and others were challenging the status quo of the church, seeking to bring about change by reforming what they saw to be inerrancies and false teaching. The church they left us was very different than the one 100 years earlier, and that reformation continues to this day as we look at the best way we can deliver Christ to the community and congregation, remaining true to our Lutheran roots, but also realizing that the world is much different than it was 10, 20, or 50 years ago. What worked then may not be the best today, and we owe it to the memory of those who came before us to constantly revive how – not why – we do what we do.

So, we always honor those who came before us, who bravely faced nay-sayers (after all, what sane congregation would form in a suburban Indianapolis community in the middle of a Depression?) and gave us a legacy we can carry to others, to Engage People In Christ at Calvary.

Chin/Burmese Liaison Position Open for 2024-25




