From the Pastors

"5 What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, as the Lord assigned to each. 6 I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. 7 So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. 8 He who plants and he who waters are one, and each will receive his wages according to his labor. 9 For we are God's fellow workers. You are God's field, God's building." (1 Corinthians 3:5-9).

I write this article to you in this period following Pastor Maxx Fisher's call visit here to Calvary and the time when we shall hear his acceptance or his decline of our pastoral call. We now find ourselves in a time of waiting and wondering. During times of waiting, many questions arise. And many of the questions that have been on my mind aren't coming from me. Plenty of people have already been asking, "How do you think it went? What did you think about him? What do you think his response will be? What did he think about...? How do you think he would fit with...?" And the list of questions grows with each person I talk to.

As natural as these questions might be, I feel like there are deeper questions that I am drawn to consider. What does God desire for Calvary? What is God calling us to devote ourselves to with our efforts and energies? How are we as the people of God here in this place and this time working together to praise and serve God for the amazing gifts that He has already given to us? For as important as it is to fill a position, I would argue it is more important for us to discern God's will for the direction of our church. As important as it might be for us to seek the right person to help lead us, I believe that it is more important that each individual member of the church ask himself or herself, "How am I using my unique gifts and skills for the greater service to Jesus and His mission?"

As much as we are praying that God is preparing that right person to come and serve as our associate pastor, I think it is only right for us to be preparing ourselves to be the right community to welcome that next associate pastor. Pastors are important but they are not the church. The people are what makes a church what it is, and the pastors are but servants within the church who help "to equip the saints for works of service, for building up the body of Christ..." (Ephesians 4:12). In our reading above from 1 Corinthians 3, Paul reminds us that the servants of God are fellow workers in the kingdom. It is only as a collected people that we can accomplish the mission that Jesus has given us. Each person plays his or her part. Each person contributes to the whole. Each person can begin to see how the seeds have been planted, watered, tended, and cared for by different people along the way. But what does Paul argue is the most important aspect of the whole process? "Only God ... gives the growth" (1 Corinthians 3:7b).

May God continue to be the one at work in each of our lives. May He continue to bring forth growth in your personal faith and life, as well as within our collective life and ministry as a congregation. May we give Him all glory, honor, and praise for it is only through Him that we stand now in the powerful forgiveness and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. He alone is Lord of the Church. He alone is the one to be praised. And so, may your prayers be that Christ would be glorified among us, whatever answer might come. May Christ be our confidence in all the ups and downs of life.

May Christ continue to lead us to be people who are ready to welcome each person who enters our doors, whether they be a potential pastor or a first-time visitor. May we continue to be about the work of **Connecting** people to Christ, daily **Learning** and growing in His Word, and **Caring** for our community and world, as we serve others in His grace.

Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

I'm taking advantage of this month's letter to call attention to some good things in our congregation. These are an outcome of our strategic planning process. If you recall, over the past 18 months, the leaders, and congregation members took a detailed approach to looking at our church through a structured process, seeking to understand the strengths, weaknesses, threats, and opportunities for our congregation.

Some very good things came from this process. One of those was we discovered there are three key areas already in place, which guide much of what we do at Calvary: Connecting, Learning, Caring, all out of Service to God. The challenge now in front of us is how do or can we use these three areas to establish Calvary's future in both the short and the long term? This is something facing Calvary's leadership over the coming months.

We also discovered there are some artificial obstacles we've allowed to build that could hold us back. For example, why are we spending money on renovations to the building (answer: things become dated, wear out, or break in a facility that has some portions 74 years old). Why are we calling an associate pastor and hiring a chief administrative officer (answer: because we need these positions to run the church, as we see a dwindling number of members being able to volunteer their time). And one that's very disturbing: why are we worrying about those outside the church? Why aren't we doing more for our members and stop looking outside our doors and our property?

This last one requires a longer answer. We are in a society that has become less Christian, more secular, and in many ways, dying. The world in which Calvary was established as a mission church in 1929 no longer exists. Our parent congregation, Emmaus, announced they are closing their school after 120 years, leaving only us and St. John, compared to four Lutheran day schools on the southside 40 years ago. The world of the 1950s and 1960s, when we built our first two classrooms and moved to our current location, is gone. Our community has changed, and what better way to visibly see it is we expanded our current sanctuary in 1997 because we outgrew the one built in 1981, but the long-range goal of a new 1,200 seat sanctuary is many years away. The congregation in which many of us grew up has changed, and either we change with it, or we end up like many other churches have in recent years. Empty or dramatically scaled back. And that's not an option or alternative any of us wants.

We have the means and the ability to reshape our church, to reach out to the lost, to educate our members, to grow in Christ, to serve our community – showing the world around us that while we preach Christ crucified, He is certainly alive and well at Calvary Lutheran. All it takes is courage, strength, and most of all, faith that He is always guiding us as we change.

Over the coming months, your leaders will be working to determine what is the best way for us to lead and guide our church into its second hundred years, which is not that far away. Be ready, be prepared, and be confident that the Spirit is always present, giving its guiding hand to help us assuredly be a place that demonstrates that spirit of caring, learning, and connecting.

Warning Labels—List of Ingredients

Much has been added to the nutrient information contained on processed food items. As a child very little was noted apart from the main ingredients in foods bought at the grocery store. Added stipulations years later required that the ingredients were to be reported in descending order from most to least. Calories and serving size were then first reported. Today's ingredient list provides the percentage of your daily recommended allowances and if the product contains milk, peanuts, and gluten. It currently cites if the food was processed in a plant that uses those ingredients in other products. The packaging information may be classified as warning labels as it provides safeguards for dietary needs.

Warning labels can be found on a host of products. Cigarette cartons and packs, alcohol bottles and cans, cars, medications, and most household appliances all contain warning labels. We are given information that may help keep us from harm and danger whether in the present or for the future.

God's Word also provides us with warning labels. God warns us to flee from the sin that so entangles us. He warns us to first seek Him. He has provided His Word to instruct and to teach us all about His love, mercy, and grace. He has given to us His Word of salvation as we rejoice this Easter in the resurrection of Jesus.

Recently I have paid very close attention to the ingredient labels on food items. It has served to educate me on the amounts of items which are placed in our processed foods and what my body is receiving for nutritional needs. We ask the Lord to provide the zeal for us to actively search His Word and scriptures for His will and direction for our lives. We read His Word to fill our hearts to rid ourselves of the poison offered to us by the devil, the world, and our sinful self. We sing a little louder as through the power of the Holy Spirit we are strengthened and renewed in our faith!

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!! Alleluia!!!

IREAD 3 Testing Results

We commend our students and teachers for an 81% pass rate on our recent IREAD 3 testing. The IREAD 3 test is given to third grade students that did not reach the pass cut line as a second grader. Only 9 students in our 3rd grade were required to take the test. This is indeed a team effort consisting of students, parents, and teachers. The instruction begins in our preschool sessions. We thank God for a student body eager to learn, parents supporting and partnering with the church and school, and teachers giving excellence each day.

Second graders were given the option to take the IREAD 3 test during the 2024 spring testing window again. 61% of these students passed the IREAD 3 test.
