From the Pastors Getting to the Heart of the Matter – The Heart of the Apostle

As we head into the months of December and January, we come to a time of reflection. As we wrap up another year and begin again, many of us try to take the briefest moment to stop, reflect, and reevaluate our busy lives. We stop and contemplate the question of what do we want our lives to really be about and what do we want to take place before another year manages to disappear before our eyes.

So the question is "Where do we begin? Where do we even get started?" I've heard it said that if you want to figure out where your priorities are look at your calendar and your checkbook because how you spend your time and how you spend your money says an awful lot about what you find important. I'm curious of what story our calendars and our pocketbooks will tell at this time of the year. But as we reflect upon this year ahead and what we would like out of it, I think this is less a question of how we've been living and more a question of how do we desire to live. After all there is always a gap between stating our priorities and living out those priorities. I think there is another place in our lives that will give us a clearer picture of where our desires truly lie and I think that place to look is our prayers. I think what we pray for and what we pray about says an awful lot about what our desires are in this life.

Stop and think about what and who you usually pray for. Maybe over the Christmas season you will be whispering a little prayer for peace and quiet or an extra ounce of sanity to deal with the relatives. Maybe you will be asking for a little bit of help to make ends meet. Maybe even a prayer for that certain gift that we have been wanting. There are countless things that could be on your mind and in your prayers, and I think <u>what</u> you ask from God the Father says an awful lot of <u>where</u> your heart and its desires truly are. This insight struck me recently as I was reading the Apostle Paul. Through his letters to fellow Christians, Paul poured out on paper the prayers and desires of his heart. With ink and parchment, Paul demonstrated what he truly wanted, not just for Christmas, but what he wanted most for his fellow Christians. Here are some examples of Paul's prayer life in his letters...

- "I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints..." **Ephesians 1:18**
- "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith." **Ephesians 3:16-17**
- "I pray that you... may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ." **Ephesians 3:18**
- "And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ... **Philippians 1:9-11**

Paul shows here that his greatest desire is that you might grasp and take hold of the precious good news of the grace and love of your Heavenly Father that is found in Jesus Christ. So wherever this Christmas and New Year might take you, I pray that the love of Christ will go with you, so that lives of faith and good fruit might spring up the whole year through. May our Lord bless you with the hope and trust that comes through His Son, who loved you so much that He was willing to sacrifice everything for you.

From Your Executive Director

Growing up in a family with deep German roots, one with a rich history of engaging with music on many levels as instructors and performers, the music of the Christmas season always held a prominent position. Whether we were attending performances (both vocal and instrumental), singing as we gathered around a piano, or listening to Christmas music on the stereo – which of course was verboten to be played prior to the Friday after Thanksgiving! – Christmas music abounded.

One album in my parent's home, and my grandparent's homes, was the LP "O Tannenbaum (Christmas on the Rhine)", recorded by Werner Müller and Orchestra in 1956. This album, originally released by Decca Records in monoaural, contained several traditional German Christmas songs. It was re-released in stereo in the 1970s by Polydor Records, but two songs were not included. (Grooves for a stereo record are slightly wider than a monaural record, so space constraints on the vinyl forced elimination of two songs.)

One eliminated song was "Wiegenlied" (Cradle Song) by Mozart, K. 350, beautiful lullaby. The other was "Transeamus usque Bethlehem" by Josef Schnabel. One can find a nice version here: www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZnmeoaQ5VRM. The song begins with shepherd's singing "transeamus usque Bethlehem" – "let us go to Bethlehem", joined later by angels singing "Gloria in excelsis". This song is not often performed, but whenever I hear it I am reminded of Christmases past.

Are you ready to go to Bethlehem this year, like the song suggests? Are you ready to go see Christ? Of course you are! So, you go to Bethlehem and see Jesus. Now what do you do? Sorry, no selfies – cameras won't be invented for over 1,800 years in 1816. Even after that, it will be another 132 years until the first Polaroid camera is introduced to the public. And posting to social media? Forget it. Do you just say to yourself "well, that was interesting" and move on with your life? Or do you start telling everyone what you saw?

Now fast forward 2,000 years. Here it is, the Advent and Christmas season. How about taking this wonderful, grace-filled story and **Connect** with others, inviting them to join us at Calvary! Help them **Learn** that Christmas is more than a man in a red suit and 8 or 9 reindeer – it is the story of God's gift to mankind. Show them you **Care** for them so as to not keep this good news to yourself but want to spread this great story! All this out of **Service** to God, who gave this incredible gift to the world.

While you're doing this, take a moment to think about someone you might not have seen at Calvary in a while. Perhaps they have not returned following the COVID-19 pandemic. Maybe there was a family disagreement years ago, and they decided to just stay away rather than facing resolution of that disagreement. Or in many cases, at some point a schedule conflict came up for a couple of weeks that kept them from attending – and that schedule is now filled with other things, like youth sports, Colts football, or other distractions keeping them from the word of God.

Reach out to these who may have not recently been to church and encourage them to come back to their church home this season, joining with their fellow Christians, as we gather to once again hear of God's gift to everyone: **Engaging People In Christ** with the blessed proclamation of redemption through the birth of His Son Immanuel. He is now with us!

The months, weeks, and days slip off of another yearly calendar and before you know it.....Christmas Day is here!! As a child, we had an artificial Christmas tree. About a week before Christmas our father would set up the tree and attach the lights. We would then get to hang the ornaments and tinsel. Their display was not orientated prior to a week or two before Christmas Day.

State Tax Credit Information

Too Good To Be True?! 50% TAX CREDIT for Indiana tax liabilities!

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 400% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

- 1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in Preschool 4-5 year olds, Kindergarten-8th grade at Calvary.

Another package will be sent out in January or February to these students. At that time we will invite congregational members to help us in mailing them out. Your prayers for our young people are always encouraged!

Thanksgiving Baskets Blessed Many! What an outpouring of love was given once again by our members! Thank you so much for your generosity! We were able to provide 17 church and school families with canned goods, pantry staples, and a gift card for additional needs. Due to your generous hearts we were also able to send canned goods to the Emmaus Food Pantry as well as Hunger, Inc. in Indianapolis. Many thanks!! (Just as a reminder, your monetary support to the Good Samaritan Fund helps us to reach out to members at this time and throughout the year.)

Christmas Gifts for the Residents of Pando Aspen Grove Apartments – This year the Lutheran Child and Family Services (LCFS) of Indianapolis has asked us to provide Christmas gifts to the residents of the Pando Apartments. This residential facility was started 2-1/2 years ago and houses young adults ages 18-24 who have aged out of the Lutherwood residential home and are currently homeless. There are 30 apartment units in the complex. Staff onsite helps the tenants navigate the challenges of independent living without any other natural supportive team of family or community. They assist the tenants in finding programs to help them complete a high school or college degree, secure employment, or learn better parenting skills. Presently the apartments house both single and married persons as well as a few young adults with children.
