From Your Executive Director

A song that does not appear in The Lutheran Service Book or its predecessors is the song "The Snow Lay On The Ground." Written sometime in the 1860s/1870s, with a tune described as a "Christmas Carol, sung in Rome by the Pifferari from the Abruzzi Mountains," its scriptural root lies in Luke 2:1-20, and the song is somewhat like "Silent Night," describing the nativity scene of that first Christmas. While it's technically a Christmas song, the first line of the lyrics are apropos this time of the year: the snow lay on the ground.

At the time of writing this, Christmas is still several days away, followed by Epiphany. Lent will be facing us square in the face, beginning March 5th. All these are in winter, and we know that it being Indiana – where we use all the weather icons in one week - there is potential that for all these events, the snow will lay on the ground. And it makes travel treacherous at times.

The apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 13:11 "When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child. I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways." (ESV). Snow is something I gladly add to that thought, for I am no longer a fan of snow like I was when I was younger. I changed.

Our lives and routines change, and this time of the year, with all the predictable New Year's resolutions, we are reminded of seasonal changes. It may be cold and snowy now, but how quickly the warm days of Spring and Summer approach.

With the new year, this is a good time to reinforce how we fulfill our mission of Engaging People In Christ: We <u>Care</u> about them. We <u>Learn</u> to grow and help carry the word to others. We <u>Connect</u> with others in our congregation and our community to share the Word. All out of <u>Service</u> to God.

These are not empty or trite expressions. They are an effort to put into words why we, as a congregation of God's people, are here on the South Side of Indianapolis.

I have frequently discussed with our congregation leaders we are in a rapidly changing society, and the impact at Calvary. Over 1/3rd of young adults have no religious affiliation, according to a Gallup poll earlier this year. There are many empty churches in our backyard that reflect this abandonment of faith. As Lutherans, while we have that great message of Christ Crucified, we are not immune to this societal trend: we have many pastoral vacancies in our churches, and at least 5 LCMS or ELCA congregations in Indianapolis have closed in the past 20 years. I expect we will see more in the next five years.

We now must be bold. We must be fearless. We must be brave. We must ignore that snow on the ground, that might make our way dangerous at times. And we cannot idly sit by and expect someone else to come along and take action. To use an old expression: the train is leaving the station. Are you going to be on or off that train?

We all know one very famous descendant of King David – Jesus. But there is another famous descendent of David, Hillel the Elder, a Jewish sage and scholar, who lived in Jerusalem during the time of Herod, who said: "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? And being for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?"

This is on all of us, and the time now. I urge and encourage you to consider – today – how you will work to Engage People in Christ at Calvary.

State Tax Credit Information

Too Good To Be True?! 50% TAX CREDIT for Indiana tax liabilities!

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 400% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in Preschool 4-5 year olds, Kindergarten-8th grade at Calvary.

2. The donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated. Example: A donation of \$1000.00 will result in a tax credit of \$500.00 towards your Indiana income tax liability. Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit. A Federal charitable deduction may also be realized.

**Donations received beginning January 1st will receive the tax credit for 2025 filing.
