From the Pastors

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-17).

Here we are again! We find ourselves soon approaching another congregational call meeting for our associate pastor position on March 2nd (or perhaps we've already had it depending on when you are reading this). But one way or another we find ourselves in that time of "prayerful consideration." We bring our needs and our concerns to God asking for His guiding care as we work together as a congregation. So often we wish that God would simply beam down the answers or send us a sign (or at least a text) that might show us the way. That however is not God's standard operating procedure.

God invites us again and again to turn to His Word, to prayer, and to conversation with fellow Christians to be shaped and formed by our "prayerful consideration" of God's will for our lives. We often confuse God's will as if there is one spot that we have to be at any given moment. We worry that with one missed sign or one wrong decision followed, we might get off track and miss that turn we should have taken. The beauty is that God is constantly at work in our lives. Despite our poor decisions, our undesired sins, and our willful stubbornness, God is able to bring things together for His plans and purposes. He is weaving together the many strands of life into the intricate tapestry of His grace. From this side of history we feel like all we see is stray ends that make no sense or plan, no rhyme or reason. But from God's side of history, He sees the beautiful images that he is creating in this tapestry of life. As Paul says in his letter to the young pastor Timothy, "I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life" (1 Timothy 1:16). Our lives DISPLAY the beauty of God's grace at work. In another place, Paul reminds us of the powerful ways that God is able to work. "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:10).

So, as we congregationally enter another time of prayerful reflection and consideration, we pray for God's will to be done among us. In so doing, we don't pray that God would simply zap us with the insight to know His plans. Instead, we turn to those places where He has promised to be:

- We heed His call, as He invites us to go deeper into His Word. "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17).
- We hear His invitation, as we go to Him in prayer and quiet reflection. "...do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4:6).
- We patiently discern his plans, as we shape and influence one another with our mutual conversation and consolation. "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another" (Proverbs 27:17).

May God continue to guide us as a congregation, but may He also guide you as an individual. No matter what worries we may face or challenges we may undergo, we know that He promises to be at work in these same means of grace.

Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

One of the challenging things in writing a monthly letter is how to make it relevant, and sometimes topical to what is going on around us. For example, I am writing this in early February to meet the deadline for our March issue. A lot could change between when this is written and when it is published and read.

One thing that will not change is what a tumultuous winter we had with bitter cold temperatures in January combined with multiple snow events. Honestly, this winter has been like that unwelcome relative who came to visit and didn't know when to leave. I suspect most of us were tired of that visitation by the end of week 2, if not sooner.

But we can now finally welcome Spring, which begins March 20th. Although we might still have snow and cold days, we take relief knowing Winter is behind us: the flowers are poking up through the ground, trees are beginning to bud, the grass is starting to turn green, and hours of daylight are ever -increasing. Welcome, Spring – and welcome to our visitors.

I have been fortunate to visit numerous LCMS congregations over the years, either while working at Lutheran Child and Family Services, traveling on business, or on vacation. From one of our original Synod churches, St. Lorenz in Frankenmuth, to our local congregations, to Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd in Greenville SC, Island Lutheran in Hilton Head SC and Fountain of Life in Tucson AZ; from Peace Lutheran in Tifton GA to St. Lukes in Oviedo FL and First Lutheran in Clearwater FL, I always felt welcome joining them for worship. One of these, First Lutheran, even carries us on their "permanent visitor" roster.

So, we welcome those who are visiting us this Spring during the Lenten and Easter seasons!

We've been talking quite a bit about our values over the past 2 years. We **CARE** about our congregation and our community. We **LEARN** to not only grow in our faith but to help others grow in their own. Where we sometimes struggle is how we **CONNECT** – not in our congregation, but in our community and with our visitors. If there is a visitor at our 8:00 service, I know there are usually two or three members who will make the effort to greet and introduce themselves to the person. The rest? I don't know.

Christ reminds us in Matthew that He will separate the sheep from the goats, specifically "... I was a stranger and you welcomed me," (25:35b). He goes on to give additional examples of how we give **Service** to Him by serving others. Welcoming is as good a place as any to start!

I'll admit it's easy to say or think "oh, someone else will welcome them" when we have a visitor. That's just not good enough. If we are a church that truly believes in our mission to Engage People In Christ, then we need to do just that: Engage those who visit. Meet them. Get to know them. Ask, and encourage them to come back – and if possible, even give them a call or text to remind them.

I suspect someone reading this is thinking "here comes another discussion about greeting people" were thrown off by the preceding paragraph. It's not enough to just greet someone and then call it a day. We must – repeat – must look for ways to engage visitors at Calvary, enabling them to grow in Christ. Our visitors are seeking, we have the answer: Jesus Christ. Our visitors are truly the future of our congregation as what one would call "organic growth" from existing families is decreasing as our members die, move away, or have fewer children.

AT&T used to run an advertising campaign "reach out and touch someone." Let's be a 2025 version of that AT&T ad, by reaching out to our visitors, helping them become engaged at Calvary as Christians, as though our future depends on it.

Because it does.

CHOICE Student Scholarship Application Window Opens March 3rd

Calvary Lutheran School will begin accepting CHOICE student applications on Monday, March 3rd. Students that are enrolled for the 2025-26 school year may apply. Household income and size will guide this application process. For example, a family of four may have an adjusted 2024 gross income tax reported of \$230,000 and qualify for a CHOICE scholarship. Please contact the school office with any questions. We will be happy to assist you with this process.

Studies have also shown that limiting video games for one-two weeks prior to the testing will improve scores. Thank you.

Thrivent Members - Did you know...

Thrivent Members, did you know that Thrivent Financial budgets a significant amount of money each year to pay the transaction costs for gifts to charitable organizations? This includes gifts made by credit card. Each year, Thrivent budgets \$300,000 to pay online processing fees for personal donations made through Thrivent's online giving platform. Calvary is an eligible charitable organization.

Scholarships available for those pursuing an education in church work

Scholarships are available for Calvary members studying to be church workers from both the <u>Wessler Family Endowment and the Student Assistance Fund</u>. Anyone who is considering pursuing an education in church work and would like more information on scholarship opportunities please reach out to the Stewardship Ministry Team.

Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs)

If you are 70½ or older, you can use assets from your individual retirement account to provide a tax-free gift to your chosen charities through the qualified charitable distribution (QCD) process. Individuals can donate up to \$100,000 per year through the QCD process. This tax advantaged tool is particularly useful for those who are 73 and above and subject to required minimum distributions (RMDs) from an IRA. QCDs can be a giving option for these individuals as it satisfies required minimum distribution (RMD) requirements while potentially providing charitable contributions tax deduction benefits. RMD withdrawals are typically considered income and subject to income taxes. But individuals can instead create a qualified charitable distribution with the RMD, where the withdrawal becomes a donation to an organization of your choice. The advantage is that as you make a contribution, you won't pay taxes on the RMD withdrawal channeled through a QCD. Please consult your tax advisor for specifics related to your personal situation.
