*From the Pastors*

*But in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. 1 Corinthians 15:20*

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

The fact of the resurrection is the central miracle of the Christian story. The early church boldly confessed that Jesus had triumphed over death! The earliest explanation of the resurrection account assumed that the tomb was empty. The disciples insisted that they had seen the living, breathing resurrected Lord. The changed lives of these disciples and the conversion of Saul of Tarsus pointed to the powerful work of a Savior who was living, reigning and resurrected.

Because Jesus rose, we have the promise that we also will triumph over death and the grave. Paul refers to Jesus as the first of fruits of the resurrection. In the Old Testament, first fruits were the initial offering of the harvest. The people of God returned the first of their crops as an acknowledgement that all of their produce belonged to the Lord. It was also a confession that they believed that there would be more crops coming in the future. The early church confessed that there would be a future harvest. Those who died in Christ would rise from the grave.

For Christians, death is like sleep. We do not fear death for it is not the final word. The Bible often refers to death as sleep. In the same way that we go to sleep knowing that we will awaken the next morning, Christians close their eyes in death confident that they will be raised. And the promise of the resurrection is glorified bodies and the eternal presence of Christ!

Easter changes the way that we look at life. Jesus is in control. And he continues to rule over this world. In the midst of change, confusion, and challenge, he provides direction and guidance through His Word and Spirit. He gathers us together to hear His Word and praise His name. He unites us together at His table as we eat and drink His real presence.

And Easter changes the way we look at death. Death (while it is still not our friend) is our entry into everlasting life. And we face life in this world with confidence and hope.

Christ Jesus, God's own Son came down, His people to deliver.  
 Destroying sin, He took the crown from death's pale brow forever:  
 Stripped of power, no more it reigns; an empty form alone remains.  
 Its sting is lost forever, Alleluia!  
 (Christ Jesus Lay in Death's Strong Bands, LSB 458)

Rejoicing with you in the hope of the Resurrection!

## Executive Director

### **From Your Executive Director**

If one drives around the city or through neighborhoods during the Christmas season, there is no mistaking that the holiday has become heavily secular. Yes, there are some who have a nativity in their front yard, but for the most part, one sees colored lights, inflatable displays, decorated trees, and the like. And many people seemingly view the holiday as “done” after the 25<sup>th</sup> of December, as the undecorating begins almost immediately after the holiday.

But how about Easter? Why does the most important day in the Christian church gets second-class treatment outside the church? There has been, like Christmas, a secularization of the holiday – just look at all the Easter bunnies and other affiliated decorations, one does not generally see large, illuminated crosses or empty tombs in someone’s front yard.

These two Christian holidays have something in common: both have popular, secular songs written about them. “White Christmas” is one of the best-known Christmas songs, and “Easter Parade” are those to which I refer, the latter not as popular as it was years ago, but still well known. But neither are the least-bit religious.

Now, we certainly have our fair share of religious Christmas songs that are heard almost ad infinitum beginning the first of November (and year-round on a SiriusXM station). However, why does Easter take a back seat to Christmas?

It's the most important day of Christianity: without Easter, there is no Christian church. Full stop, end of story. Instead of a resurrection, we have a dead body in the tomb. Even the 1970s rock opera “Jesus Christ Superstar” called it quits at that point, for the ending song in that musical is titled John Nineteen Forty-One, which reads “Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid.” (ESV) At least Mel Gibson hinted at the Resurrection in his blockbuster movie *The Passion of the Christ*.

Perhaps, as Christians, we have been too good at keeping this holiday to ourselves, instead of using it to Engage People In Christ. We understand the significance but may have done a poor job promoting it outside the church. There used to be an ecumenical sunrise service at Southport High School – in the football stadium or in the fieldhouse – with voluntary participation from the various school choirs, but that event stopped many years ago and was never replaced.

This Easter, try to change this downplaying of the event of our Savior's conquering of death, by helping others Connect to the holiday. Learn its importance, understand that Christ's love and Care for us is found in unfathomable amounts on the day: that His sacrifice was done out of Service to God.

The hymn [At The Lamb's High Feast We Sing](#) contains the very powerful words:

*Easter triumph, Easter joy! / This alone can sin destroy; /  
From sin's pow'r, Lord, set us free, /  
Newborn souls in You to be. / Alleluia!*

What a blessing! What a gift! One we need to share with the rest of the world, when we proclaim “He Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!”

### **Calvary Connects Update**

Last September we initiated a capital campaign (Calvary Connects) to enhance our ministry by making much-needed improvements to our facilities. Two of the projects for this campaign (the Café and the women's restroom in the Narthex) are complete. The upgrade of the men's restroom is slated to be the next phase for this project. While we are still getting pricing for the project phases, it is expected that all the phases of the project to have a total cost of approximately \$1,250,000. Calvary's leadership initially designated \$500,000 from our reserves as a challenge match to encourage participation in the capital campaign.

As of March 2026, we are well over halfway to our initial goal of \$750,000 in pledges from our members. With over \$600,000 pledged by our members to date, we have more than met the \$500,000 challenge and are at about 80% of the initial goal of \$750,000.
