#### As We Gather

The Easter Vigil leads us from the darkness of Good Friday into the joy of Christ's resurrection. In the early church, worshipers spent the night before Easter waiting and watching for the sunrise. New members of the Christian community were baptized at this time. We see in our worship tonight the connection between our baptism into Jesus' death and the new life which emerges by being raised up with Him, for "If we have been united with Him in a death like His, we will certainly also be united with Him in a resurrection like His" (Romans 6:5).



#### **Opening Sentences**


- P: People of God, on this holy night we gather in waiting, vigil, and prayer.

#### A Reading of God's Word

John 1:1-5

- L: <sup>1</sup> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning. <sup>3</sup> Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. <sup>4</sup> In him was Life, and that Life was the Light of all mankind. <sup>5</sup> The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
- C: May the light of the risen Christ scatter the darkness of our lives and enlighten all the world with God's salvation. Amen.

(Please extinguish candles. Continue holding them upright until the wax has time to cool.)

(The sanctuary lights are raised.)

## Our Confession of Sin & the Announcement of Forgiveness

- P: On the Saturday of Holy Week the darkness of Good Friday still hung in the air. We come however knowing the joyful outcome, and yet we must admit that we still see the darkness of sin in our world and in our own lives, the darkness that led Jesus to lay down His life for us. We therefore go to him in confession of our continued need:
- C: Lord Jesus, we come to You acknowledging the darkness that still maintains a foothold in our lives. It is evidenced in our thoughts, words, and actions. Our lives do not always bear witness to the power of Your resurrection. Forgive us and lead us by the power of Your Spirit, so that we may walk in Your ways.
- P: People of God, the Jesus who died on Good Friday arose triumphant on Easter Sunday, giving us the promise that he would never leave us, not even in death.

  Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of our risen Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the T Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

#### **Baptismal Remembrance**

Based on Romans 6

(The early church baptized new believers during the Easter Vigil. After a period of instruction, they were welcomed into the community. Through the life-giving waters of baptism, they were connected to Jesus' death and resurrection. And so today we remember our own baptism.)

- P: The word of God says: "Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"
- C: We were buried with Him through Baptism into death so that just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.
- P: If we have been united with Him in a death like His,
- C: We will certainly also be united with Him in a resurrection like His.
- P: For we know that our old self was crucified with Him so that the sin of our body might be done away with,
- C: We need no longer be slaves to sin—because anyone who has died in Christ has been freed from the power of sin.


New Testament "For I delivered what I also received"

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

<sup>1</sup> Now I would remind you, brothers [and sisters], of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, <sup>2</sup> and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. <sup>3</sup> For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, <sup>4</sup> that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, <sup>5</sup> and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. <sup>6</sup> Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. <sup>7</sup> Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. <sup>8</sup> Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. <sup>9</sup> For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. <sup>10</sup> But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. <sup>11</sup> Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

#### "Unexpected tidings at the tomb"

Mark 16:1-8

LSB 474

<sup>1</sup> When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. <sup>2</sup> And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. <sup>3</sup> And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" <sup>4</sup> And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large. <sup>5</sup> And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. <sup>6</sup> And he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here. See the place where they laid him. <sup>7</sup> But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." <sup>8</sup> And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Hymn of the Day & Ringing of the Bells "Now All the Vault of Heaven Resounds" LSB 465 (We are reminded throughout the Bible that our earthly worship both mirrors and connects with the worship that is taking place in heaven around the throne of God. In church tradition, the ringing of small bells within the worship service is a reminder of the songs of the angels. Today we ring our bells as a reminder that both heaven and earth rejoice at the great news that Jesus has been resurrected from the grave. He lives! Alleluia!)

- 1. Forgiveness Am I sorry for my sin and desire God's forgiveness? (Matthew 26:28)
- 2. Faith Do I believe that Jesus is my Savior and that he is truly present in this meal for my benefit? (1 Corinthians 11:26-28)
- 3. Fellowship Do I come to this table desiring reconciliation with others (Matthew 5:23-24), and am I in agreement with the beliefs of this faith community in which I now seek to receive communion? (1 Corinthians 10:16-21)



**Gluten-free wafers** are available on stands at the end of the first row for those with a gluten allergy to pick up on their way to the communion rail.


Non-alcoholic (white) wine is available at the center of the communion tray.

After being dismissed with a blessing, please return to your seat using the center aisle.






