The Lighting of the Advent Wreath

- P: Each week in Advent, we light a candle as we prepare for the arrival of our Savior, who once came as a helpless child and will one day come in the fullness of His glory, for in a world of darkness, a light shines. Jesus Christ is the light of the world.
- C: The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. (John 1:5)
- P: The fourth Advent candle has been known as the angel candle and the candle of love. As our Advent season soon ends, we await the angelic message of the good news of a Savior. God's love has been revealed in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16) "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us..." (1 John 3:16a)
- C: The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.
- P: Guided by the light of love, we respond with the psalmist: "Your steadfast love, O LORD, extends to the heavens,
- C: Your faithfulness to the clouds.
- P: Your righteousness is like the mountains of God;
- C: Your judgments are like the great deep...
- P: How precious is Your steadfast love, O God!
- C: The children of mankind take refuge in the shadow of Your wings.
- P: For with You is the fountain of life;
- C: in Your light we see light." (Psalm 36:5-9)

"Characters of Jesus Birth"

Luke 2:1-20

¹ In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶ And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

⁸ And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. ¹⁰ And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. 11 For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. 12 And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, 14 "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" ¹⁵ When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." 16 And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷ And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. 18 And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

- 2. Faith Do I believe that Jesus is my Savior and that he is truly present in this meal for my benefit? (1 Corinthians 11:26-28)
- 3. Fellowship Do I come to this table desiring reconciliation with others (Matthew 5:23-24), and am I in agreement with the beliefs of this faith community in which I now seek to receive communion? (1 Corinthians 10:16-21)






For Prayer & Personal Reflection during Communion Distribution
