

Confession of Sin & Announcement of Forgiveness

The Absolution - John 20:21-23

- P: In our first reading from the prophet Jeremiah, God says, "I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more." (Jeremiah 31:34), reminding us that we do not need to hide our sins. Instead, God calls us to confess them, and so we draw near with a humble confidence, knowing that our God stands ready to answer our prayer.
- P: Forgive us, Father, for we are prone to bury our guilt in our hearts.
- C: But then it comes back to hurt us and haunt us.
- P: Forgive us, Father, for we are prone to blame our guilt on someone else.
- C: But then it burdens other people and damages our relationships.
- P: Forgive us, Father, for we are prone to beat ourselves up with guilt.
- C: But this leaves us down, depressed and despondent, stuck in a pit of despair.
- P: And so we cry out:

ALL: Lord, have mercy! Christ, have mercy! Lord, have mercy!

P: Our Lord reminds us in His Word today that Christ Jesus has provided purification for all your sin (Hebrews 1:3b). The blessing of His cross and resurrection is yours today. Therefore, upon this your confession, I, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

C: Amen.

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Third Sunday of Advent - The Candle of Joy

- P: Jesus Christ is the light of the world,
- C: The light no darkness can overcome
- P: Each week in Advent, we light a new candle, marking the gifts of hope, peace, joy, and love, for Jesus Christ is the Prince of Peace and Lord of love.
- C: We wait for the Lord, and in His Word we rest.
- P: O Lord, let the lighting of these candles signify that You are the light that shines in all the darkness of our lives. As we wait, watch, hope, and pray, guide us to reflect Your light in all we do and say; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.



³¹ "Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, ³² not like the covenant that I made with their fathers on the day when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, declares the Lord. ³³ For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴ And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the Lord. ¹ Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. ³ He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴ having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

"Zechariah's song of the tender mercy of God" Holy Gospel Luke 1:67-79

⁶⁷ [At the time of John the Baptist's birth] his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied, saying, 68 "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people 69 and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David. ⁷⁰ as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old, ⁷¹ that we should be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us; 72 to show the mercy promised to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant, 73 the oath that he swore to our father Abraham, to grant us ⁷⁴ that we, being delivered from the hand of our enemies, might serve him without fear, 75 in holiness and righteousness before him all our days. 76 And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, ⁷⁷ to give knowledge of salvation to his people in the forgiveness of their sins, ⁷⁸ because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high ⁷⁹ to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

The Apostles' Creed


I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

- 2. Faith Do I believe that Jesus is my Savior and that he is truly present in this meal for my benefit? (1 Corinthians 11:26-28)
- 3. **Fellowship** Do I come to this table desiring reconciliation with others (Matthew 5:23-24), and am I in agreement with the beliefs of this faith community? (1 Corinthians 10:16-21)

Non-alcoholic (white) wine is available at the center of the communion tray.


