From the Pastors

Reflections and Questions on the Call Process (Part 4)

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven" (Ecclesiastes 3:1).

Over the past several months we have been reflecting upon the pastoral call process here at Calvary. So far we have looked at the questions: "What are we looking for in a pastor," "What are we hoping this pastor will do," and "Why is this process taking so long?"

Being that Pastor Paul Dickerson recently declined the position in October, this month we reflect upon the question, "How do we deal with the disappointment when a pastor doesn't accept?"

There are many reasons that a pastor may choose to remain in his current congregation and current position. A call process is not the same as a job interview. The candidates involved in a call process are not always looking for a new church and a new position, but we are asking them to be open to considering where God is leading them in their service within the wider "church." A pastoral call is also not a corporate ladder by which someone climbs to higher ranks or higher authority or even higher pay. We seek through a call process to match the unique skills and personality of a pastor to the unique needs and personality of a congregation. While there are many places a pastor "might" serve faithfully, the Lord does have unique plans for the ministry of His church. Thus far in both the calls that we have extended, we have seen candidates that would have and could have served at Calvary very well. They fit our church culture, our position, and our mission and ministry very well. They had incredibly positive things to say about our church, our leadership, and our ministry. They were very likable people to those who met with them during their deliberation process. Unfortunately for us but not for God's wider kingdom, each candidate saw that the Lord was leading them to serve in other capacities at this time. They both spoke positively about how this time of deliberation helped them clarify how God is using them in their current ministries and where He is leading them in their future service.

So, if there is anyone out there asking the question, "Is there something the matter with us, our position, or our process," then I would share that both candidates have very clearly answered that their decision came down to what God is doing within their ministry and family life, and not any concerns of what is going on at Calvary.

While it can be hard to not see the progress that we desire and while it can especially be difficult for the call committee and other leaders who really start to get to know these pastors, we know that God is still in control. How do we deal with these disappointments? We turn to God's Word which gives us the reminder that Jesus is still Lord of the church, we still have the great joy of the forgiveness and love of a Savior who will never leave us nor forsake us, and that we as a congregation and individual members of it still have a mission that we are to be about it. We comfort ourselves with God's words of promise and we continue to pursue His will and guidance as we seek him in prayer and in the mutual conversation of fellow believers. May God assure you that He has this covered and may He continue to guide our congregation as we take our next step forward within this pastoral call process.

Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

When November rolls around, our thoughts (and stomachs) may think about our Thanksgiving holiday. That, or avoiding the Christmas displays that appeared in every retail store in September to remind us that Christmas is soon upon us.

Fun fact: The word "thanks" has its root in the Middle English work "thanken", which comes from the Old English word "pancian", which itself comes from the German word "Dank" (or "Danke"). In fact, many of our English words trace their origin to German. Seeing that our denomination has its roots in Germany, it is interesting the influence that country had on early Europe.

Giving thanks should extend beyond Thanksgiving Day, as we are reminded again and again to thank God for His blessings. "Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever!" wrote the Psalmist in Psalm 107:1-3 (ESV), as one example. The words "thanks" or "thanksgiving" appear 72 times in the Bible. Our Lutheran Service Book contains two well-known songs about thanks: the 1844 hymn "Come, Ye Thankful People Come" (#892) and the 1978 song written by Henry Smith "Give Thanks With A Grateful Heart" (#806). Being thankful is nothing new to us!

But how do we give and show our thanks?

We know we should not be like the Pharisee in Luke 18:11-12 (ESV) who "standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.'"

<u>That is boastfulness, not thankfulness</u>. The Pharisees, with all their rules, were "religious" but that's as far as they got. They were going through all the motions, but forgot that for all their rites and rules, they lost sight of why they were doing them: they were rote because they had to do them.

How can we avoid this trap? How about starting with: we give thanks because we can, not because we must. We aren't called to be religious. We are called to be Christians. And we have the grace to act on this by giving and showing our thanks.

We can show our thanks by being engaged with Christ. By caring for our neighbors. By connecting to Him through Bible and small group studies. By learning ways to carry out why we are here. By emulating Christ, as we serve others just as He came to serve us.

And look at the ways we can demonstrate that thanks: volunteering for a project at church or in the community. Helping someone who needs assistance. Listening to someone who is hurting and just needs someone to talk to. Financially supporting our congregation so we can in turn help others in need, like Lutherwood or one of our local food banks.

Or to put it another way: be bold with thankfulness, at all times and places.

Yes, we could be like the Pharisee, who tried to thank God for certain things he was – or wasn't. What a futile task, to try and thank God for specific things – how much simpler it is to acknowledge Him as our creator and thank Him for everything!

Museum Visits

Every student welcomes the opportunity for field trips for a day outside of school. It provides an opportunity to experience new and wonderful things. As a child growing up in Chicago a common field trip was to visit the Museum of Science and Industry (MSI) and the Field Museum of Natural History. The MSI is housed in the Palace of Fine Arts in Jackson Park which was erected for the World's Fair in 1893. The Field Museum is in Grant Park. Both are architecturally designed buildings with beautiful archways, vaulted ceilings, and the smell of ancient artifacts. (The Field Museum has even a more distinctive smell) I remember the displays at the MSI of yesteryear with an old dentist office, steam engine, and Nickelodeon silent film. There was also a chick hatchery on display as you entered the MSI. I remember the dinosaur bones, Egyptian mummies at the Field Museum. All vivid memories of our museum field trips.

Museums may often reside in the past. They depict the history and advancements of ingenuity thought. What most museums ignore is the sovereignty of God. Evolutionary thought is pronounced. Opening Doors

God has blessed families of Indiana with the choice of sending their children to the school that they feel best meets their needs. The LUTHERAN SGO of Indiana has changed the boundaries of the local school and greatly broadened them. You can open even more doors allowing students to enter the hallways of Calvary Lutheran Church and School. This opportunity will provide scholarship grants to students and their families. Contributions made by you for this purpose will be used to offer a Christian education so that children may not only receive a quality education, but to hear God's Word.

How do I help open these doors? Contribution forms for Lutheran SGO are available online at www.LutheranSGO.org. The state of Indiana will give you a tax credit of 50% of your donation. Example: If you give a gift of \$1000.00 you will receive an Indiana state tax credit of \$500.00. This is a unique opportunity. Funding for these scholarship grants for current students enrolled at Calvary is \$81,000.00. We have currently gathered approximately \$17,000.00. Those desiring to contribute to this fund may do so through December 31 to receive the tax credit for this 2024 calendar year. We anticipate a need of \$65,000.00 for the goal to be met. Any additional funds gathered will remain in our account with the Lutheran SGO of Indiana to be used during the 2025-26 school year. We ask the Lord to provide for the needs of others through the gifts of our hands.

Connections Conference- November 25-26


