From the Pastors

Answered Prayers ... and Our Collective Call to a Partnership in the Gospel

As for Titus, he is my **partner** and co-worker among you;

as for our brothers, they are representatives of the churches and an honor to Christ" (2 Corinthians 8:23).

"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your **partnership** in the gospel from the first day until now" (Philippians 1:3-5).

"I pray that your **partnership** with us in the faith may be effective in deepening your understanding of every good thing we share for the sake of Christ." (Philemon 1:6).

"So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me" (Philemon 1:17).

"I, John, your brother and **partner** in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus" (Revelation 1:9).

What does it mean to have a partnership? What especially does it mean to have a partnership in the Gospel? Throughout the New Testament this idea of being partners together for the sake of the Gospel is scattered across multiple books, authors, and situations. The New Testament constantly emphasizes the oneness of the church. It is constantly reminding us that we are not a collection of individuals, we are a community of unity in Christ. The idea of partnership comes with the idea of working together so closely and intimately that we work as "one body."

We celebrate the wonderful news the Pastor Mark Schumm has accepted our associate pastor call. We certainly consider it God's blessed answer to our prayers. He has raised up another individual for the work of God's kingdom here on the southside of Indianapolis, and for that we are grateful. But we must also remember that we are partners in this work. One thing that I love about Calvary is our idea of "team" ministry. It is not simply that we have a team of called and contracted workers on our staff. It is the fact that we see our church working as a "team" at all levels in all areas. We celebrate our ministry teams and the work that they coordinate. We celebrate the staff teams that serve in our different areas of mission. But we especially celebrate that we have a team of partners in the gospel, no matter what role, position, or status we hold or don't hold. We are partners in the gospel because that is our very identity as those who have all been baptized into Christ Jesus. In our baptism we have certainly been saved <u>from</u> something. We have been washed of sin and its stain. We have been clothed with the very righteousness of Christ. And yet it is also in our baptism that we have been saved <u>for</u> something. We have been called and equipped to be a part of the priesthood of all believers. Each partner in the gospel has his or her unique gift to contribute to the team.

And so as we celebrate having another team member who will partner with us as the people of God in Pastor Schumm, we also remember that God is calling each of us to service. He is calling each of us to live for something bigger than ourselves, and that is to live to the glory and honor of Jesus Christ, who has loved us, even when we did not love Him.

We pray for God's mighty Spirit to continue to lead and guide His church that we may stand firm on God's truth and reach out with God's grace. We pray that God will continue to draw us together as partners in the Gospel, as we lift high the name of Jesus through connecting, learning, and caring, all for the sake of serving our risen and reigning Lord.

From Your Executive Director

In 1970, Terre Haute native and former AT&T employee Robert Greenleaf published his first essay, "The Servant as Leader", introducing the term "servant leadership" to readers. Based on Hermann Hesse's book <u>Journey to the East</u>, Greenleaf – while never explicitly referencing but certainly inferring Mark 10:43b-45 ("But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.", ESV) – began a lifetime mission to promote that for someone to be an effective leader, they first had to be an effective servant to those they lead. I have taught classes in this several times at our church, as I am a strong believer in this leadership model.

We have talked much about why we exist as a church: to **Connect**, to **Care**, and to **Learn**, out of **Service** to our LORD. Let's take a moment to discuss Service and Serving, as we approach our annual congregation meeting with the election of ministry team members, leaders, and officers.

Sometimes it seems we act as an environmentalist church: we recycle leaders over and over, reverting to the same members to serve the congregation. One might say "this is great, as they know how things work". I say this is constraining, as we are not growing future leaders, and face reusing old programs, procedures, and so on. As the adage goes, when the only tool you have is a hammer, everything looks like a nail.

We have a lot of hammers in our congregation, and we need to equip ourselves with a broader toolbox filled with different tools – those tools being our members, with many different skills and abilities. And this congregation belongs to the members of Calvary. Calvary is yours.

All together now, "what does this mean"?

It means we collectively enjoy the benefits of our congregation. The worship. The fellowship. The learning. The teaching. And yes, the building itself for our many events. But this comes at a price and responsibility: in turn, to serve.

There are many opportunities to use your gifts at Calvary. We need ministry team members. We need ministry team leaders. We need volunteers to help with projects, with mission work, with taking care of all aspects of our worship life. We need volunteers to be the next generation of leaders, and officers, of our congregation. We need to stop being a recycler that relies on the same people year after year.

So, if asked to serve, consider doing so willingly, cheerfully, with a grateful heart to our LORD who, as written earlier, was a servant to us, and by doing so gave us the unmerited give of eternal life in the process. And we certainly give thanks to God for the latest servant of His people at Calvary, Pastor Mark Schumm, who soon joins us as our Associate Pastor. Welcome, fellow servant!
