Change?

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness" (Lamentations 3:22-23). "For I the Lord do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed" (Malachi 3:6).

Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

We made it! We survived another Indiana Winter and a Spring that couldn't make up its mind – and Summer is finally in sight. Summer. Warm days, hot days, or muggy days. And nights that can be cool, warm, or sometimes miserable if one is trying to sleep without air conditioning.

I don't particularly enjoy Winter, but the prospect of Spring and Summer makes it bearable to me. Watching the flowers come up, the flowering plants bloom, the trees as they leaf out – the changing of the seasons (and the weather) make life in Indiana a continual changing experience.

One never knows when the seasons really change, contrary to the calendar. I recall more than one year we seemed to go right from Winter to Summer. Or the year we had snow at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway in May – the year Winter just wouldn't leave.

We Hoosiers know that the changing of the seasons is inevitable, and we've come to not only accept, but in many ways celebrate those changes. Think of going to Brown County in Autumn to see the leaves, for example.

Like the seasons, Calvary is changing. Your leaders have been working the past three years to find better ways to conduct the temporal affairs of our congregation, to enable our pastors to focus on being "Pfarrer und Prediger" – Pastor and Preacher – than administrators.

One change is coming to our annual meeting in June, when revisions to our Constitution and Bylaws will be presented to the voting members for approval. These revisions have been in review and revision for 18 months and were made following the extensive strategic planning conducted three years ago by the entire congregation. Some of the ways these changes work towards the outcomes from that plan are:

- Freeing our ministry teams from administrative to missional, to accomplish why they exist at Calvary.
- Streamlining our operations, enabling us to function in a better manner for the good of the congregation.
- Reinforcing our Mission: Engaging People In Christ and how we accomplish that by Learning, Connecting, and Caring out of Service to God.
- Clarifying roles and responsibilities that were sometimes uncertain in prior revisions.

They are a start and a means to improve how we work together as people of God at Calvary. Martin Luther described a Christian as "simul Justus et peccator," one who is righteous and a sinner at the same time. These revisions are sort of the same: we sought to improve but realize that as humans, anything we do will be imperfect.

Like the seasons, we need to change and not be stuck in one cycle, otherwise we never become better. Yes, there will likely be more changes in the future, as we work as His people to constantly improve and look for better ways to effectuate our mission and goals.

The Chinese philosopher Laozi (Lao Tzu) said, "a journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." This is the first step of a renewed journey we make as brothers and sisters in Christ!

Just as physical growth and change is obvious after a summer hiatus, our desire is that the students' growth in their faith walk is obvious as well. May the Lord grant to all a wonderful summertime of transitions and growth as faith is evidence in action. May the Lord watch between you and me while we are apart one with another.



June 1, 2025 - The Ascension of Our Lord

Many times, people have wondered, "Why did Jesus leave the earth?" Would it not have been better for Him to remain? Jesus' work on earth was done. It was time to return to heaven. Join us on Worship Anew as we discuss the reasons why Jesus ascended to heaven.
