From the Pastors

Something Better - Hebrews 1:1-14

Advent is a season devoted to waiting. We wait to celebrate the incarnation of Jesus. We wait for the return of Jesus on the last day. But as well-known singer (and lousy theologian) Tom Petty observed, "waiting is the hardest part." Waiting can often be difficult. The circumstances of our world encourage us to lose hope and abandon our faith.

The book of Hebrews addresses Christians in Rome undergoing persecution sometime close to 64 A.D. when Christians began dying for their faith under Nero. The book is a clarion call to not return to Judaism, which was a legal religion while Christianity had become an illegal religion.

The author urges people to remain faithful to their Christian confession (Heb 3:1; 4:14; 10:23), warns against drifting away and neglecting salvation (Heb 2:1, 3), points out the danger of losing confidence in God's promises (Heb 3:6) and falling away from the faith (Heb 3:12). People were tempted to become rebellious and unbelieving like Israel (Heb 3:16–19) for they had not progressed into Christian adulthood (Heb 5:11–6:2). They had experienced God's saving gifts in Christ but may end up rejecting him (Heb 6:4–6; 10:29; 12:25). Sluggishness (Heb 6:12) could lead to something far worse- abandoning the faith (Heb 10:26). The author repeatedly reminds people that in Christ, they have something far better.

Our Advent theme for weekend worship is titled *Something Better*. Hebrews repeatedly explains the gifts God gives Israel through Moses and then promises that we have something much better! Our sermon themes are as follows:

Nov 30/Dec 1 "A Better Word" (Hebrews 1:1–2)
December 6/7 "A Better Glory" (Hebrews 1:3a)
December 13/14 "A Better Absolution" (Hebrews 1:3b)
December 20/21 "A Better Name" (Hebrews 1:4–14)

Our Sunday morning Adult Bible Class will offer an overview of Hebrews. This will be followed by a close look at several key passages in the book, including Hebrews 11—the Bible's great "faith hall of fame" chapter. Please plan to join us as we prepare for the coming of our Lord!

"Calvary Connects" Capital Campaign

We've all seen the progress that has already been made as we begin the upgrade of our facilities, including the new Calvary Café and the remodeled women's restroom. Facility improvements and upgrades are much needed and are consistent with the actions recommended by the most recent Calvary strategic plan to better connect Calvary with the community.

A few weeks ago, the Stewardship Ministry Team mailed Calvary members a letter that described the Calvary Connects facility improvements capital campaign. 

Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

After months of preparation from the retailers who were selling Christmas decoration goods before the month of September ended, here we are: another Advent and Christmas season. SiriusXM started playing Christmas music before November was over, and Mariah Carey has officially come out of hibernation to immerse us in "All I Want for Christmas is You".

One carol we will hear and sing, both at church and in our homes and cars, is "Hark, The Herald Angels Sing", a glorious choral setting to Luke 2:13-14, composed by German composer Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy in 1840, set to lyrics written by Charles Wesley in 1739.

Some may know that Mendelssohn was a member of the Lutheran church in Germany. But he didn't start that way: he was the grandson of a famous Jewish Enlightenment philosopher, Moses Mendelssohn. Felix's father, Abraham, renounced his Jewish faith before Felix was born, and went so far as to drop Mendelssohn as a last name, adopting his wife's adopted surname of Bartholdy, to fully break with the Jewish community. On March 21, 1816, at the age of seven, Felix was baptized into the Christian faith.

Like Mozart before him, Mendelssohn was a child prodigy. He gave his first concert when he was nine years old and in 1824 composed his first Symphony at the age of 15. He was also heavily influenced by and considered himself the successor to J.S. Bach, championing a drive to erect a monument to Bach in Leipzig, funding much of the cost from his personal fortune.

Besides the Christmas song we all know, his 5th Symphony drew on his Lutheran faith, composed for the 300th Anniversary of the Reformation – appropriately now referred to as the Reformation Symphony, as the 4th movement is built around Luther's "Ein feste Burg." Sadly, like Mozart (composer Robert Schumann wrote that Mendelssohn was "the Mozart of the 19th century"), he died young at the age of 38, believed caused by strokes brought about from overwork: he composed 750 works during his short life.

Mendelssohn's story and his application of his faith to his music is profound, one which can be found to this day in other music forms, specifically contemporary Christian music.

His faith, and how he carried that into his compositions, has meaning for us at Calvary, especially this time of the year. We will have many visitors during the Advent and Christmas season. School families. Relatives. Former members. Community residents who are looking for a church home. And significantly, people who consider themselves non-religious, but are searching because they realize something is missing in their lives.

<u>This is our Mendelssohn moment</u> – the ability to demonstrate our faith to these visitors, showing and telling them about the saving grace of Jesus Christ, of His love for us, which was manifested this time of the year with his birth in a manager.

We can Engage them. We can Connect to them. We can help them Learn. This is how we Care for them! We welcome them into our church home, sharing with them an incredible gift: Jesus Christ, and His salvation for us. This is our application of faith opportunity, sharing Christ with our community. What a blessed gift we are able to share: helping to make theirs – and ours – a happy and blessed Christmas!

(Or as those of us with German ancestry would have said, "ein frohe und gesegnetes Weihnachtsfest"!)

State Tax Credit Information

Too Good To Be True?! 50% TAX CREDIT for Indiana tax liabilities!

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 400% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.
