From the Pastors

Taking a Moment to Assess

⁷ "But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸ Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ" (Philippians 3:7-9).

At this time of year, we often assess. We assess the good and the bad of the year gone by. We assess the possibilities and opportunities of the new year ahead. We assess where we are and where we want to be. We assess what is gain and what is loss.

So, how goes this year's assessment? Are things stacking up in your favor or does it feel like everything is stacking up against you?

- Where are you celebrating? Where are you mourning?
- Where have you seen gains? Where have you experienced loss?
- Where is God inviting you to take a step of faith? Where is God closing a door?

These are all important questions to consider. They are not meant to be another way of "beating" ourselves up for where we have fallen short. Instead, these opportunities, invite us to consider where the intersection of God's grace and promises with our current situation.

Paul knew what it was like to assess the value, meaning, and purpose of life in general, as well as his words and actions in particular. Many commentators have noted that in Philippians 3:4-14 Paul can be seen assessing his past, his present, and his future. It was a moment in which Paul certainly recognized the deep regrets of how he had been living, and yet it was a moment in celebrating the amazing grace of God that had forever changed His outlook on life. When Jesus came into Paul's life, there was a complete reassessment of everything he knew, believed, and practiced. It was such a great change in what he valued that he triumphantly proclaimed, "But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord" (Philippians 3:7-8). In Jesus Christ, Paul had stumbled upon the treasure hidden in a field and the pearl of great price. In Jesus, Paul found his true treasure, which changed how he evaluated everything else in his world. In Jesus, Paul had something of true value that the world could never take away.

Even some 2,000 years later we still have the same treasure of the gift of Christ Jesus our Lord in our lives. And we too have the same promise that He has forgiven our past, He is at work in our present, and He is leading us to a promised future. And it is for this reason that as you start to assess the conclusion of one year and the start of a new one, that we can first and foremost celebrate the gift of His grace that has forever changed our world and our lives. We can step into a new year with confidence because we know that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever (Hebrews 13:13). And however this year's assessment may turn out, we can join in celebrating with John Newton, the author of the famous hymn Amazing Grace, that "I am not what I ought to be. I am not what I want to be. I am not what I hope to be. But still, I am not what I used to be. And by the grace of God, I am what I am."

May God bless you and yours in the new year, as we step forward in faith, knowing that there is nowhere that we can go that our Lord's mercy and grace does not go with us.

From Your Executive Director

According to the Pew Research Center, about 30% of Americans make at least one New Year's resolution – and by February 1st, 13% have kept none of them, and 28% have kept some of them. I personally adhere to what my favorite curmudgeon, Mark Twain, wrote about them: "Thirty days from now, we shall have cast our reformation to the winds and gone to cutting our ancient short comings considerably shorter than ever."

In other words, I guess the simplest way to keep New Year's resolutions is just to not make any resolutions. You'll keep 100% of those you don't make.

Yet just because we may not make formal resolutions, the new year gives us a *tabula rasa*, with the ability to start a new year afresh. I am reminded of Revelation 5, where we read "And he (God) who was seated on the throne said, 'Behold, I am making all things new.'" In this case, it refers to the New Heaven and the New Earth. But it also applies to us at Calvary.

In some ways, we are seeing this in our congregation, with several new things. From a facilities approach, we have a new café, a remodeled women's restroom, and more on the way. From an organizational approach, we have a new structure that has freed our ministry team leaders and members from administrative matters, letting them do why they are in those roles. We have new Associate Pastor as well.

And of course, we have a new direction for the congregation following the strategic planning we conducted in 2023, setting out new ways to Learn, to Care, and to Connect, out of Service to God. New programs have been implemented, and new ideas are consistently sought, to help us put these new ways into effect.

But you know what isn't new, and hasn't changed? Our commitment to the never-ending, never-changing word of God. We haven't changed our proclamation of Christ's saving Gospel. We continue to, as Lutheran Hour speaker Oswald Hoffman frequently proclaimed, to preach Christ Crucified. We remain a Liturgical and Confessing church, faithful to the works and writings of the reformers. We consistently seek to Engage People in Christ at Calvary.

So, if you happen to take time to make resolutions for the new year, here is one suggestion: resolve to reach out to others in our community and be a living demonstration of the love that Christ has given to us, telling our neighbors about His glorious story – and how they can experience that at Calvary.

State Tax Credit Information

Too Good To Be True?! 50% TAX CREDIT for Indiana tax liabilities!

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 400% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.
