### introduction

#### TO VALIANT WARRIORS

In the Old Testament, certain groups of men were noted as "valiant warriors" or "men of valor." These men displayed courage and determination in battle. King David had his "mighty men." These men proved themselves to be trustworthy in battlefield situations. These brave warriors were not limited to one tribe or people group. They were only limited by their courage and determination.

Valiant means possessing or showing courage or determination. Obviously, a warrior is one who is engaged in a war. A war has been underway since the Garden of Eden. The kingdom of God has been under assault by the kingdom of darkness. Satan's temptation to Adam and Eve that led to their sin resulting in the Fall of all mankind was the declaration of war against God's kingdom.

Biblical manhood and masculinity was also attacked in the garden on that day. Adam had been created first, given dominion over the earth and even named his wife. Satan did not initially go to Adam but to his wife, Eve with the temptation. It is understood that Adam was most certainly right there while his wife was being tempted. Adam abdicated his leadership responsibility in protecting his wife. He then followed her into the same sin that she had committed. Since then, God's people have battled against the kingdom of sin and darkness. But also, men have battled for biblical manhood and masculinity.

Men are at their best when they are valiant warriors, battling for the kingdom of God and rescuing the disadvantaged in the name of the King. Robert Lewis subtitled "Men's Fraternity," A Quest for Authentic Manhood. Valiant Warriors hopes to be another leg in the race or step in the journey in this quest. David challenged his son, Solomon in 2 Kings 2:2-4, "I am going the way of



all the earth. Be strong, therefore, and show yourself a man. Keep the charge of the LORD your God, to walk in His ways, to keep His statutes, His commandments, His ordinances, and His testimonies, according to what is written in the Law of Moses, that you may succeed in all that you do and wherever you turn, so that the LORD may carry out His promise which He spoke concerning me, saying, 'If your sons are careful of their way, to walk before Me in truth with all their heart and with all their soul, you shall not lack a man on the throne of Israel.'"

We hope to show men how to be men, valiant warriors through this study. We believe that the key to men being transformed is first by the Word of God. Another key is men in small groups for discussion, prayer, accountability and encouragement. As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another. It is out of that desire and vision that we have embraced the following guidestones.

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#### **Valiant Warrior Mission**

To disciple men to follow Christ and to live and lead in their homes, churches, and communities for God's glory.

#### **Valiant Warrior Vision**

To see an army of men devoted to Christ leading their families and this church to serve Christ and bring Him glory until Jesus returns.

### **Valiant Warrior Strategy**

To disciple men in small groups to lead their families and their church to serve Christ and bring Him glory until Jesus returns.

#### **Valiant Warrior Promise**

Judges 6:12 "The LORD is with you, O valiant warrior."

#### Valiant Warrior Code of Honor

To grow in Christlikeness personally. To be committed to my family and Christ's church. To intentionally encourage other men in Christlikeness and commitment to the church.

### VALIANT WARRIOR INTRODUCTION TO THE SPIRITUAL ARMOR

My first Valiant Warrior study was on the spiritual armor found in Ephesians 6. After 10 semesters of Valiant Warrior after that initial study, I have decided to cover this material one more time.

Valiant Warriors are engaged in a war. We battle in a spiritual battle.

The Apostle Paul describes for us the nature of that battle. He also gives us the necessary instructions for success in that battle. As we look at the spiritual armor found in Ephesians 6:10-20, we find the basics to the Christian life. The spiritual armor is basic discipleship strategy. Like most sporting competition, the competition is won by those who do the basics the best. So, what the essentials are for spiritual battle are the same essentials for everyday spiritual life.

Read what Paul wrote to those believers in Ephesus in the first century. Remember, he instructed them on great doctrinal truth in chapters 1-3 so they would know what to believe. Then, in chapters 4-6, he gives them practical ways to apply this doctrine to their every day lives. These verses on the spiritual armor serve as the conclusion of this book.

#### Ephesians 6:10-20 (NASB) Spiritual Warfare

"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might. Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore, take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand firm therefore, having girded your loins with truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; in addition to all, taking up the shield of faith with which you will be able to extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. With all prayer and petition pray at all times in the Spirit, and with this in view, be on the alert with all perseverance and petition for all the saints, and pray on my behalf, that utterance may be given to me in the opening of my mouth, to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in proclaiming it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak."

Each lesson will be focused on one piece of the spiritual armor. It is important to note prayer is a major part of this passage of Scripture. Our battle is spiritual and not fleshly, so we must use spiritual armor as opposed to physical armor. Our aim in rediscovering biblical manhood is unveiling the spiritual realm where our victories are won and lost in prayer and by spiritual means. We know we sometimes lose battles along the way, but our goal is to ultimately win the war. Be encouraged to stay in the battle. Fight to the end. Do not quit.

Winston Churchill said, "If you're going through hell, keep going."

The order Paul covers the different pieces of spiritual armor is different than the order I use in this study. Paul's order is first inspired by God. Paul's order is also logical in what a soldier would put on in its most likely order.

The biblical order is belt, breastplate, shoes, shield, helmet, and sword. The biblical descriptions of truth, righteousness, gospel, faith, salvation, and Word/Spirit can also be considered as an order to the process.

I actually put on the full armor of God in prayer from head down to help me remember: helmet of salvation, breastplate of righteousness, belt of truth, shoes of the Gospel, shield of faith, and sword of the Spirit.

Our Valiant Warrior study is different. My basic order is a theological order. The Word of God is first because everything we know about anything spiritually comes from the Word of God. Salvation comes from the imperishable seed of God's Word. Salvation is the birth of the believer spiritually. It is the beginning of spiritual life. Righteousness is obtained at salvation through faith. We are justified by faith. We walk by faith. We please God by faith. We take up the shield of faith. The belt of truth is a practical righteousness of telling the truth, believing the truth, and obeying the truth. Lastly, we put on the shoes of the gospel in going and sharing the gospel. It is a process of discipleship that begins and is rooted and supported throughout by God's Word that leads to salvation and imputed righteousness. Our salvation leads to a life of faith fueled by the truth of God's Word that results in making new disciples.

All of the armor is for the front of the soldier. The Valiant Warrior is on the offensive. He is charging the gates of Hell with the promise they will not prevail against him. This is the picture of a soldier taking the battle to the enemy. This is not a defense system for men waiting around to be attacked and just playing defense. The reality is we have already been attacked. We must take up this armor and deploy an all-out attack on the enemy.

# week one VALIANT WARRIORS AND THE WORD OF GOD

#### Ephesians 6:17 And take... the sword of the Spirit which is the word of God.

The first century soldier had a short, dagger-like sword for up close hand-to-hand combat. Paul captured that idea in describing one piece of the spiritual armor all believers need in the battle. We are using a specific order to cover these pieces of the spiritual armor. We have intentionally selected the sword of the Spirit first, because everything flows out of our understanding of the Bible. If we can get it right on the Bible, then it makes all the difference on everything else. If we miss it on the Bible regarding authority, power, and reliability, then we enter the battle with no offensive weapon. Typically, if you have no offense you cannot win.

Moses was a man who believed God's Word. He is the author of the first five books of the Bible. He lived his life based upon the Word of God spoken to him. Moses heard the Word of God first in the burning bush. He was led by the Word of God spoken to him through the plagues and the exodus. He was given the Law of God on Mt. Sinai.

This book will keep you from sin, and sin will keep you from this book.

The sword is primarily an offensive weapon. It is really the only offensive weapon in the armor. A case can be made for the shield of faith at times. The sword is how we defeat our enemy. It is the key to winning our spiritual battles. It is important to realize and understand all of our battles are primarily spiritual.

I believe the single most important spiritual discipline for every Christ follower involves the Word of God. Everything we know about God, Jesus, and salvation is learned from the Bible. The Bible is sharper than any two-edged sword. The Bible is a living book (not meaning it is a changing book). The Bible is a powerful book.

#### How do we know the Bible is reliable?

Textual criticism is the study of manuscripts for accuracy from the original documents. Manuscript evidence of the Bible exceeds all other secular historical sources. For example, *The Illiad* by Homer is considered the most documented historical source of antiquity with 643 surviving manuscripts with its earliest copy dating 400 B. C., which is 500 years after the original was written in 900 B. C. Compare that to the New Testament that has over 24,000 copies with the earliest copy within 25 years of the original document.

There is also the testimony of the church throughout history. The church has widely accepted the reliability of Scripture through over 2,000 years of church history. This does not mean some have not questioned the reliability of Scripture; but the Church Fathers and church leaders have overwhelmingly attested to the reliability of Scripture.

There is also internal evidence of the Scripture itself. The Scripture claims reliability and authority in 2 Timothy 3:16 and Psalm 119. Jesus quoted Scripture as authoritative. Prophecy fulfilled validates the reliability of Scripture. Archaeological evidences authenticate the reliability of Scripture.

There is personal evidence in changed lives attesting to the power and authority of the Scripture.

It is called the Sword of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the author of the Scripture, so the Holy Spirit works in conjunction with and by the Word of God. He never contradicts His Word. The Word is evidence of the presence of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit guides us unto all truth.

Think about what you read more than trying to read a lot.

Memorize/meditate a verse of Scripture regularly.

Ask, "How does this verse apply to my life" as you read the Bible. If you cannot think of a way, then keep reading until you get to a verse you can apply.

#### **Helmet of Salvation**

The warrior's helmet protected him from all kinds of potential dangers. Something as minor as a bump on the head could render a soldier ineffective in a battle. The helmet protects the head. The head is the key in carrying out all the actions necessary during a war. The head houses the eyes and the ears. The brain and the ability to reason and think are under the protection of the helmet. Valiant Warriors are thinkers. The description as a "helmet of salvation" elevates the value of this piece of equipment. The sword of the spirit gives us the battle plan. The helmet of salvation is the first step in becoming a real soldier.

#### **Breastplate of Righteousness**

The breastplate may have been the most important piece of armor considering its location and purpose. It protected the vital organ of the soldier —the heart. It would be the equivalent of a police officer wearing a bulletproof vest today. A wound to the heart could be fatal. Valiant Warriors engaged in spiritual warfare must keep their hearts pure before God. Our eyes and our minds or thoughts are windows into our hearts.

David was a man after God's own heart. He believed in the goodness and greatness of God from an early age. He was chosen by God at an early age to be king of Israel. He wrote many psalms expressing his love and devotion to God. He also expressed great repentance of sin in Psalm 51.

#### **Shield of Faith**

The shield was considered primarily a defensive weapon. Certainly, thinking about quenching the fiery darts of the enemy brings to mind flaming arrows being deflected by a metal shield or absorbing the projectile in a wooden shield. The shield also could be used as an offensive weapon, Captain America style. We will want to consider our faith as men in both regards. It is like when a defensive player intercepts a pass or recovers a fumble, he switches from defense to offense.

Abraham was the father of faith. He believed God and it was counted unto him as righteousness (Romans 4:3). He left the Ur of the Chaldeans to follow God even though he did not know where he was going (Hebrews 11:8-19).

# week five THE VALIANT WARRIOR AND INTEGRITY

#### **Belt of Truth**

While this belt was not an item used to inflict pain on the enemy, nor was it used to soften the blow from the enemy, it serves a very important purpose. The Roman soldier Paul was so familiar with used a belt to hold up his garments so he would not get tripped up in the battle. The truth keeps us from tripping ourselves up. In some ways, the belt of truth could be considered along the lines of the sword of the Spirit as both are, in essence, truth. The belt of truth might be better taken as the application of truth to our personal lives. It is telling the truth, believing the truth, and obeying the truth. Also in view is the breastplate of righteousness. A man's integrity is measured in terms of character and purity of heart. This belt of truth intersects the truth of Scripture and truth in our hearts to call a man to integrity.

Daniel was a man of great integrity. He demonstrated integrity early in life as a teenager thrust into a foreign culture where they changed his name, his language, his diet, and his location. He maintained his integrity when his life was on the line. He showed his integrity as an old man refusing to not pray resulting in the lion's den hotel for a night.

#### Shoes of the Gospel of Peace

How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news. Romans 10:15; Isaiah 52:7

One old song has the line in it, "These boots are made for walking." Paul saw the sandals worn by the Roman soldier for the purpose of taking the message of the kingdom out into the streets. Paul's description of the spiritual armor is brief, contained in just a few verses. It should be put on all at once. But the depth and magnitude of the armor implications is like drinking from a fire hose. When all the other pieces of armor are actively in play, then the shoes of the gospel of peace run a lot better and faster. Making disciples through sharing the gospel is most effective when have assurance in the Word of God and our salvation while walking in faith, purity, and integrity.

Paul was the missionary to the Gentiles and Peter was the missionary to the Jews. Peter was brought to Jesus by his brother Andrew. Paul persecuted Christians, stoned Stephen, and met Jesus while blinded on the Damascus road. Paul wrote the spiritual armor passage. He intended to emphasize the difficulty and challenge of the battle. This is the offensive thrust of the battle. The spiritual battle is over the souls of men and women and boys and girls. It is not so much a battle for the culture today, but rather it is a battle for the souls of people for an eternity. Earthly kingdoms have come and gone. Billions of people live under harsh anti-Christian dictators just as in Paul's day. Paul's mission and our mission today is to rescue people out of the kingdom of darkness.
