Week One | The World Did

USE THESE QUESTIONS AND RESOURCES TO HELP YOU PROCESS THE MESSAGE IN YOUR PERSONAL STUDY TIME OR WITH YOUR GROUP.

Message Recap: The Christmas story didn't begin with shepherds watching over their flocks, wise men following a star, and a young couple that couldn't find a place to have their baby. It began much earlier than that, and it was more epic than anyone could have imagined.

Main Points

- The whole world would be blessed because the whole world needed blessing.
- The Christmas Story is part of an unbelievable, incoherent, and impossible promise.

Setting Started

- How do you feel heading into this Christmas season?
- Is this a positive or negative time for you?

Observation

- Read and reflect on Genesis 12:1-3; Isaiah 49:6; Malachi 1:1; Galatians 4:4; Luke 1:26-33
- What are your initial reactions to these passages? What do you find challenging? Are you encouraged by any of these verses? Why?



• It's Christmas! What a great time to reach out to your neighbors. Bring them a small gift, some hot chocolate, maybe some cookies. If you've never met them before, introduce yourself. Bring them an invite to our Christmas Eve services.



- Do you find it difficult to believe the details of the Christmas story? Why or why not?
- Talk about a time when God seemed silent or distant in your life. How did this experience affect your faith?
- Reread Genesis 12:1-3. In what ways does God's promise to Abraham change our view of the Christmas story?
- Look back at Isaiah 49:6. What does this verse tell you about God's character?



• Talk as a family about who you know (friends, family members, neighbors) that need to hear about the hope that comes in the story of Christmas. Pray for those people together as a family, then ask God for the courage to share that hope with them. We can help, too, invite those people with you to one of our Christmas services!

Next Steps and Prayer

- What can you do this season to focus on the meaning of the Christmas story to our community and in your life?
- Close by praying for God to show you something new about himself this Christmas season.
