Mark 12:18-27



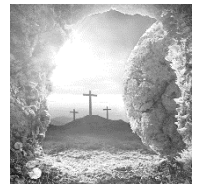

8. What are some mistaken ideas about heaven, even from the Sadducees?
9. What is needed if we are to be spiritually healthy?
10. How many times did Jesus foretell His resurrection, and how many post-resurrection appearances did He make?
11. To make His point, where did Jesus quote from that should have convinced the Sadducees?
12. What man of faith showed that he believed in the resurrection?
13. What did Paul say about the resurrection?
14. How have many Christians demonstrated their belief in the resurrection through the centuries?
15. What common events remind us that God is a God of the living?
