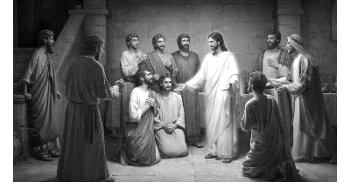


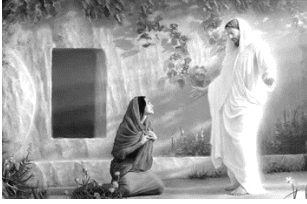
Sunday AM Sermon – March 31, 2024

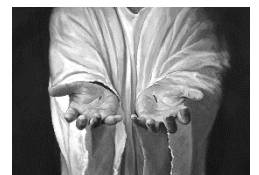
