## Greetings!

I hope this newsletter finds you content and enjoying the grace and peace that come from our Father above. God provided a lot of opportunities on this trip to help expand the reach of Leicester Bible institute. So let's dive in!



On October 4<sup>th</sup>, my group arrived in London. This time I was able to bring along David Conder. David joined me last year when we held the Leicester Men's Day. I also had the honor of bringing along Gary & Amy Witcher. Gary & Amy work with SIBI's Senior Adventures in Ministry (Senior AIM) program. For them this was a survey trip for possibly taking a Senior AIM trip to England in the future. It was a pleasure to have these three individuals with me.

As with any stop in London, we took some time to view the sites.





Saturday evening we were privileged to get to visit the elders, deacons, and minister of the Stratford congregation in London. We met in the home of one of the elders. The Stratford congregation has approximately 150 members with 130 of those being very active. They do have several members actively participating in LBI. One of the impressive things about the Stratford congregation is their use of Zoom. They

utilize Zoom daily for

various activities of the congregation including LBI, two different children's classes (one for not baptized and the other for after baptized), ladies' classes, and a morning devotional from 6am—7:40am every Monday through Friday. This began as a covid outreach but has continued as they have members from other countries participating as well. Each morning they have 80-90 attendees for their morning devotionals. The Stratford



congregation has 13-14 different nationalities in attendance each Sunday and has been in existence for 22 years. They have had over 300+ visitors just this year alone. They are in the

process of looking for their own building as they are currently renting a room at a Catholic school for their services. This is the congregation I recommend you visit if you ever find yourself in London on a Sunday morning.

Sunday morning we were blessed to be able to join the Milton Keynes congregation for Bible class and worship. I taught Bible class and then presented the lesson during worship. There is also a good group here of LBI students. When Katya and I were in England last May, we were with Milton Keynes for the



ordination of their first two elders. It

was wonderful to get to spend time with the Milton Keynes congregation. We had 100 in attendance when we were there, The Milton Keynes congregation celebrated their 20<sup>th</sup> year of existence

this year.

That evening we had the pleasure of joining

Paul and the Leicester congregation for a baptism. Jamie, Millie's friend, whom she had been studying with gave himself to Christ in baptism. This is the 14<sup>th</sup> baptism this year in Leicester. It was encouraging to see several members of the Leicester congregation there as well as to experience a baptism in the new building. Jamie's



family and some of his best friends were there for his baptism. Paul did a good job explaining what and why Jamie was doing in getting immersed into Christ. All of these visitors also left with a new Bible. For those who helped to provide funds for these Bibles: THANK YOU!!

Because Janet had her doctor's appoinment on Tuesday, we had a day without Paul. So we went to Birmingham to visit Cody & Kelsey

Marceau. Cody is an ex-AIMer. He and his family of 6 have been serving in Birmingham for 1½ years now – primarily focused on Muslim refugees. They are involved in various activities like a run club and a soup kitchen – all including these refuges. They have found many of them to be receptive. They have them in their home and can have 40-60 attendees for their Thursday devotional/prayer groups. It was nice to get better acquainted with them. We were also



able to share with them the benefits available to them through the Leicester Bible Institute.

The picture to the right has special significance that I did not know before this trip. The lady in yellow is Sabina. She is one of the reasons why Paul & Janet decided to begin the church in Leicester. Sabina and two other ladies had begun taking the bus from Leicester to Loughborough to go to church. Paul was initially thinking of starting the church in Derby. One evening after service in Loughborough, Sabina's prayer request was for a congregation to begin in Leicester. Paul & Janet decided that night that God had called them to plant a church in Leicester. Sabina's living



room is where they met for the first time to plan the Leicester church. The rest, as they say, is history. Sabina is also financing a church building being built in her hometown in Ghana.




