

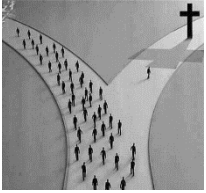
Sunday AM Sermon – February 2, 2025

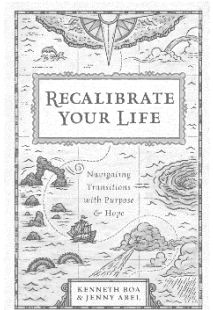
