# Kevin Rapp SIBI NEWS LETTER



### **Dear Family**

As my 4th term at SIBI comes to a close, I want to take a moment to thank each of you for your constant prayers, encouragement, and support. It's been a spiritually enriching and academically challenging journey, I am deeply grateful for how God has continued to work through you and in me.

This term, I have had the opportunity to dive deep into several very impactful courses that have strengthened my understanding of Scripture and how to lead in ministry





New Testament Church:

I learned how the New Testament church is not just a historical reality but part of God's eternal plan, revealed through prophecy and fulfilled in Christ. I gained a clearer understanding of the Biblical identity of the church, the pattern of teaching that leads to salvation, and the importance of practicing "pre-denominational" Christianity. What I valued most was being equipped to address modern issues-like the role of women and music in the church-with both biblical truth and a spirit of unity. The teaching outlines and book reports helped prepare me to educate and lead a congregation while maintaining peace and faithfulness to God's Word.

#### **1 Corinthians:**

We examined the historical and cultural background of Corinth and the challenges faced by the early church. I learned how Paul addressed division, immorality, and other issues with a Christ-centered approach, emphasizing unity, love, and the value of the body of Christ. What I valued most was developing the habit of turning to Scripture when facing difficult questions, seeing how love, above all, should guide our actions in the church. The study of chapter 7 on marriage, divorce, and remarriage especially helped me think critically and Biblically about complex topics I will likely face in ministry.



**Conflict Resolution:** 

This short course was incredibly practical and insightful. One of the most valuable things I learned was how deeply emotional and relational systems impact the health and growth of a congregation. I came to understand that conflict within the church doesn't just affect the people involved-it often hurts the most vulnerable among us. I learned that emotions, especially anxiety, are contagious and can create repeated patterns of dysfunction unless addressed with maturity and spiritual awareness. Tools like emotional validation, self-differentiation, and understanding system theory really helped me see how to manage tension in a healthier way. I also realized how important it is to avoid people-pleasing, to recognize red flags in church behavior. and to handle antagonism with calm professionalism. What I appreciated most was how these lessons were tied to biblical principles and real-life ministry challenges. preparing me to lead more effectively, compassionately, and truthfully.

# 1st & 2nd Thessalonians / Philippians:

OBSERVE HOW GOD WORKS THROUGH THOSE EFFORTS. AND REALIZE THAT EFFECTIVE EVANGELISM IS **ROOTED IN BEING AUTHENTIC. PRAYERFUL.** AND FOCUSED ON REACHING THE LOST TOGETHER AS A CHURCH FAMILY.

We enjoyed group singing at the Owens' home, breakfast with one of our Instructors, Kevin Haynes, and his amazing wife Becca, we concluded our term by having a BBQ, which we affectionately call a "Glawe Out" thanks to our amazing instructor Mat Glawe.
