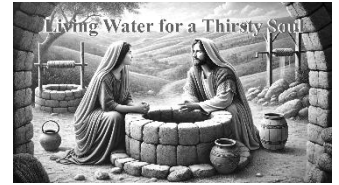


Sunday AM Sermon – May 31, 2026
