# **DEVOTIONS**



Read: Matthew 6:25-33.

This reading is part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. It is his opening declaration of the kingdom of God that he brings. It is a message full of good news that is wrapped in the theme: "Do not worry." Why not worry? Because we have the God who cares for all that God has created, including the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. Instead of worrying, our life's focus needs to be planted in God's reign and righteousness. Righteousness is not simply a moral category. God's righteousness is a creative and redeeming power to establish and maintain a relationship to us and to all that God has created. It is a life-giving power that brings judgment to all that destroys life so that justice and mercy may have the last word. God's kingdom provides what is needed. In the midst of all our woes and fears, there is reason for hope and even thanksgiving because we have the God in Christ who will not let us go and who claims us with steadfast love and faithfulness.

Discuss: How does trusting in God's care for you give you peace and a thankful heart? Pray: Loving God, you who care for the birds of the air and the lilies of the valley, give us thankful hearts that rest in your care for us through Christ our Lord. Amen.

# **SERVICE**



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Thanksgiving Day Bible Readings and theme for this day, how can you express thankfulness to someone this week?

# **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**



Thankfulness is a way of life (Joel 2:21-27). It can be based on our momentary comforts and pleasures. For a Christian, a thankful heart is not based on our possessions or social standing in life, but on the love and mercy of God shown to us in Jesus. On this day of giving thanks, take time to think or talk about what God has done for you to give you a thankful heart. Write each thought on a piece of paper.

*Pray:* Gracious God thank you for [read list]. Thank you for blessing us with your goodness each day. Help us to respond with a generous heart. Amen.
