

Jesus has finished**




John 19:28-30 (completion)

*"Later, knowing that all was now **completed**, and so that the Scripture would be **fulfilled**,*

*Jesus said, 'I am thirsty.' A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips. When he had received the drink, Jesus said, 'It is **finished**.' With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit."*





History/Fact

Testimony of John

1. **Jesus suffers abnormally**, even for the crucified.
2. He **dies of thirst**, from blood loss and trauma.
3. He **truly died**, and his death was 4x confirmed.
 - Judgment – Obviously dead
 - Check – Spear to see that he is dead
 - Confirmation – Bleeds as a dead man
 - Certainty – Test is also a mortal wound

- The end of all bodily strength
- The longing of true torment (Luke 16:24)
- The most critical provision (Exodus 17:3)

"Wine-Vinegar"



Psalm 69:21: *"...They put gall in my food
and gave me vinegar for my thirst."*

Meaning:



The one that gives real life
by quenching true thirst,
dies in our place thirsty,
drinking the paltry,
degraded substitute
of the world,
so that we don't have to.

John 7:37-39

"On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, 'If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him.'"


PRAYER OF CONFESSION
