

Rule of Life

A pattern of life to focus and shape our practices around abiding in Christ by walking as Jesus walked. (John 15, Ephesians 4:20–21)

Or:

A practical plan to abide in Jesus by walking as He walked.

Rule of Life: for and different for everyone

A "Rule of Life" like "church membership" is not prescribed in Scripture by name. However, like church membership, everything *in* a Rule of Life is part of walking as Jesus and being His disciple.

However, our individual specifics will be different.



Month 2: A Plan to FOCUS abiding and shaping...

...require focus on an epicenter of our attention and the removal of anything that diverts or distracts us from it.

("Shape" is the focus of month 3)

Focus requires simplicity achieved through frugality.

Simplicity and Frugality

Simplicity

The elimination of diversion by successfully narrowing how many things take our attention, energy, and time.

The uncluttered, unhurried state that makes focus possible.

Frugality

A discipline of restraint, not bestowing our resources outside of the focus of simplicity.

The virtue that achieves and renews simplicity.




Elimination is for focus.

Craftsmanship




Contrast

1. Elimination is everywhere in Scripture.

Elimination is a necessary part of the way of Jesus.

Matthew 6—2 masters





2. Elimination has to be done.

Achieve and maintain simplicity with frugality

Lay aside not just the sin that entangles but also everything that hinders us in pursuing the course of Jesus.

Hebrews 12:1–2

Therefore, since we are **wrapped up** by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us **throw off every encumbrance** and the **sin that so easily entangles**, and **let us run with perseverance the race** marked out for us.

Starter and completer

Matt. 9:42, Luke 17:2, (millstone) Acts 28:20

(chain), Heb. 5:2 (garment of weakness)

² Let us **fix our eyes on Jesus**, the **piòneer and perfecter** of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Entanglement vs. Encumbrance

Entanglement

You can't move



Encumbrance

You won't get far



Frugality toward entangling sin and every encumbrance

Worries of this life, deceitfulness of wealth, desire for other things. (Mark 4:19)

Sin that entangles 2 Peter 2:20

Eph 4: Put off Lying and deceit Loosing and keeping anger Don't steal

Love means overcoming impurity and greed.

Everything that encumbers

Heb. 12:1—encumbrances 1 Cor. 9—train like a boxer 2 Tim. 2:4—civilian affairs Luke 10- Martha

Anything that:

- Deceives us
- 2. Encumbers us
- Inhibits us

2. Elimination has to be done.

Achieve and maintain simplicity with frugality

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
3. Therefore: Purge to perspective, not perfection. (which is much more at first)

Eliminate to empty so that you can really redecorate.

Our perspective on what focus is for us and what is distracting us is skewed and deluded in our present state.

No one else can make room in your life.

No one can be your doorkeeper.





We can make a collective action problem a collective action solution.

Simplicity is not:

- 1. Perfect calm without any "crazy"
- 2. Having a quiet and clean home all the time
- 3. Severe austerity and complete minimalism
- 4. Just an issue of schedule

Simplicity is a state of life designed to make focus on God our first priority, so "all these things" can be given to us as well. It is haste (to do good), without hurry (lost deliberateness): Diligence with deliberateness.

Challenge: Challe

Remove what:

- 1. Entangles—sin
- 2. Encumbers—world
- 3. Deceives—flesh
- 4. Inhibits—devil
