1 Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called *as* an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ² which He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures,

The Significance of Rome

There were:

- 50,000 in the church at Rome.
- Their faith was proclaimed worldwide. (Rom. 1:8)
- The bishop of Rome rose to prominence.
- Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome.
- The martyrs of Rome were venerated.
- The Roman Emperor, Constantine, protected Christianity.
- When the empire fell to the tribes, the Roman bishop, Gregory I, <u>preserved</u> civilization in the face of the barbarians. Rome became "the City of God."
- Then the "pope," Gregory I, evangelized their conquerors by monasteries and monks sent out to the tribes.
- Western Europe became Christian under Rome's initiative.
- As the western emperor declined, the Pope replaced him in power. Popes Leo and Gregory I spared Rome from the Huns and Vandals.
- In church councils, Rome proved the tiebreaker.
- Rome missed the Muslim conquests in the East.
- The Roman bishop crowned Charlemagne as Holy <u>Roman</u> Emperor, and in a sense Rome lived again.
- Someday, a 10-nation confederation will resurrect Rome.

And as the papacy became corrupted, all of Christendom fell.
