


God's Promise | Genesis 8:20-22






God's Faithfulness (8:20-9:17) God's Blessing | Genesis 9:1-7

9:1 God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth. 2 The fear and terror of you will be in every living creature on the earth, every bird of the sky, every creature that crawls on the ground, and all the fish of the sea. They are placed under your authority.

God's Covenant | Genesis 9:8-17

8 Then God said to Noah and his sons with him, 9
“Understand that I am establishing my covenant with
you and your descendants after you, 10 and with
every living creature that is with you—birds,
livestock, and all wildlife of the earth that are with
you—all the animals of the earth that came out of
the ark.




Humanity's Sinfulness (9:18-29)

18 Noah's sons who came out of the ark were Shem, Ham, and Japheth. Ham was the father of Canaan. **19** These three were Noah's sons, and from them the whole earth was populated.

20 Noah, as a man of the soil, began by planting a vineyard. **21** He drank some of the wine, became drunk, and uncovered himself inside his tent.



Let Canaan be Shem's slave.


27 Let God extend Japheth;


