

Questions

1. Is there something in your life that feels overwhelming, maybe even broken beyond repair? Is there any comfort or hope for you in the truth that God created the universe out of nothing? What does it say about His capacity to redeem or make new that which seems shattered in your life?
2. How can we explain the existence of light on Day Two when the sun and stars are created on Day Four? What does it say about God that He brought light into existence without any need for the sun?
3. What are some examples of separation in the creation account? How does God separating or distinguishing between two things reflect His character? Have you recently tried to blur any lines between what God calls good and bad?
4. Why is it important that we believe God used six days to create the universe (regardless of what you believe about the length of those days)? How does Exodus 20:11 provide one answer to that question?
5. Can you think of any principles that should guide a Christian's thinking about scientific claims, especially those that might challenge an element of Scripture?
6. How does the Apostle John identify Jesus in John 1 (see especially verses 1-5 and 14)? How does John relate his teaching about Jesus to Genesis 1?
7. Take some time to worship the amazing creative power of Jesus and the humility that took Him from heaven to the cross?
