2. Read Hebrews 11:7. What do you think Hebrews 11:7 means by godly fear? In what way(s) could you be more motivated by godly fear?
3. How does God's grace/favor make a difference in the story of Noah? How does God's grace/favor make a difference in your story?
4. What are some of the discoveries science has made that appear to be consistent with God's Word?
5. How does God's protection of Noah in the ark seem to point to the believer's position in Christ?
6. God was able to completely save Noah, his family, and the living creatures. Does that give you hope when you consider your own need of rescue from God's wrath?
