


Questions

1. Based on Luke 24:27, 44-47, and John 5:39-40, what did Jesus say about the Old Testament Scriptures, and why is that important for our reading and understanding of the Old Testament?
2. How would you describe the sin that enticed Eve (cf. Genesis 3:5)? What are some similar ways in which we are tempted?
3. How does it encourage your worship to know that God's plan to redeem sinners for Himself was established before the foundation of the world (cf. Ephesians 1:4; John 17:24; and Revelation 13:8)?
4. Read John 10:10. Couple that truth with the ongoing hostility promised in Genesis 3:15. What does that say about the nature of Satan's work in the world? How does Genesis 3:15 also speak to suffering faced by believers in a fallen world?
5. In what way is Genesis 3:15 the first declaration of the gospel of Jesus Christ?
6. Read Romans 6:1-11. How do the truths of your union with Christ influence your understanding of the victory won in Genesis 3:15?
