3. In what way might it have been unwise for Mordecai and Esther to be living in Susa (consider Jeremiah 29:1-14)?
4. Based on the plot that will be exposed in Esther 3, in what way were covenant promises of God ultimately at the center of the conflict in the book of Esther?
5. If you have found yourself in painful or hard circumstances due to another's sin, or due to your own unwise choices, or a combination of both, what does Esther reinforce to you?
6. The book of Esther will show us God delivering His people. Who is your deliverer?
7. Consider the gospel of Jesus Christ. What are some elements of that good news that can speak to a Christian who is struggling with their current lot in life? What hope is there for that person?

As we are introduced to the book of Esther, we will encounter a strong view of the providence of God even though God is not named throughout Esther's story.

Setting the Scene (2:1)

1. On account of man's evil (2:2-4, 12-14)
