## Questions

1. Genesis 3:15 holds the first promise of a coming Savior. Genesis 10 describes the nations as descendants of Noah. But in Genesis 11, the nations are dispersed, leaving a question: From which of those nations would the Savior come. Based on Genesis 12:1-2, how did Yahweh answer that question?
2. Consider God's forming of a nation through Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (Genesis 12, 15-18, 21, 24). What are some examples of God sovereignly overturning man's logic? Why does this matter (cf. Deuteronomy 7:6-9)?
3. What are some examples of Israel's stubborn refusal to trust Yahweh? Read 1 Corinthians 10:1-12. How do these examples serve believers in Jesus Christ today?
4. Romans 8 is a message to believers of assurance, based on God's promises. How does Romans 9 – 11 then fit? Why does Paul feel the need to address questions about Israel's rejection of Jesus (cf. Romans 9:6)?
5. How have Gentiles been blessed as a result of Israel's rejection of its Messiah (cf. Romans 10:19-20; 11:11-12)?
6. Read Psalm 122:6. How might this verse encourage you to pray?
7. How does the promise of a future ingathering of Jews into the body of Christ give us hope in God's promises and plans?
