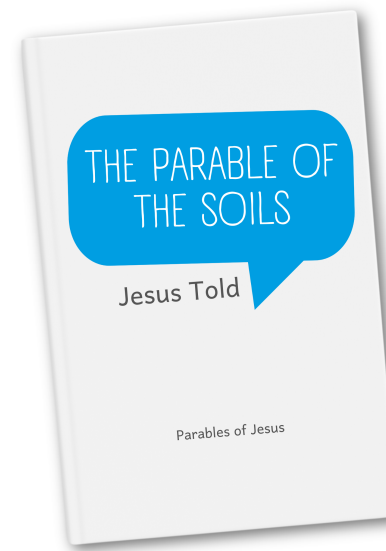


Questions
