4. Are you saving money? If not, how could you begin to save?
5. Read Proverbs 21:5. How do you plan your spending and saving?
6. When is the last time you were tempted toward a quick purchase? Did you give in or pause to consider it more carefully? Are there safeguards you can employ to slow down spending decisions?
7. What can we learn about lending and borrowing from Proverbs? How might Proverbs 22:7 affect your use of credit cards?
8. Do you give generously to people you know in need? Do you give generously to the Lord's work in your local church? If not, how can you start?
9. Read Proverbs 30:7-9. How do these verses influence your thinking about wealth?
