THE IRREDUCI-BLE MINIMUM - I really enjoy speaking to children. It's because it

makes me think about what's really important.

Last night, I had the chance to speak to our Wednesday Night Team Kid 3rd -6th graders. I was given 15 minutes to share. I hope you enjoy reading this as much as I enjoyed sharing it. The important thing to keep in mind is this:

What is the most important thing they need to know - and how can I share it, and how can they remember it, and what does that mean? That's it.

Here was my assignment -Genesis Chapter 11 - "The Tower of Babel"

The most important thing "God is a strong tower"
and "He can destroy all
human towers"

How can this be shared -

- 1. Repeat after me "God is a strong Tower".
- 2. Flex your muscles and say "God is a strong Tower".

- Ask "Who is a strong tower?"
- 4. Have little fun with different poses.

Read Gen. 11:1-4

- 1. Ask "What did the people do?"
- 2. Use blocks and start talking about building a tower and give a visual.
- 3. Ask if this is a strong tower.
- 4. Talk about weak human towers versus the strong tower of God.

Read Gen. 11:5-9

- Ask "Which is stronger, God or the towers men build?"
- 2. Allow one of the students to come forward and get ready to destroy the tower.
- 3. Let the student knock over the tower.
- Share a couple of sentences about God knowing us and coming down to help destroy the wrong things in our lives

Review - the irreducible minimum

- 1. Flex and say "God is a strong tower".
- 2. Ask "Which is stronger -

God the strong tower or the towers men build".

3. Ask "What happens when people trust their own towers?"

From the Bible - the irreducible minimum for you and I is this:

- 1. God loves us.
- 2. We have messed up and need God's help.
- 3. Jesus came to earth to provide the help we need.
- 4. The help came when Jesus died on the cross and rose from the grave.

Let's never forget that all important, most important thing - one more time.

- 1. God loves us.

 How can we remember it?
 Tell it to yourself, believe

At the end of August we are 67% through the budget year and have received 65% of expected income and expended 59% of projected expenses. The Building loan ended August with a balance of \$62,972. The reserves of \$49,816 reduce the amount we owe to \$13,156. We appreciate your continued faithfulness and dedication to God's work.
