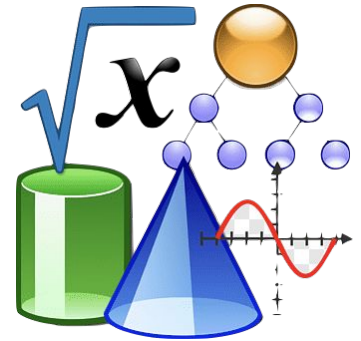

RETURNING STUDENTS:

1. Go to [khanacademy.org](https://www.khanacademy.org)
2. **Log in by continuing with Google.** Use your school issued email **ONLY**. example@phcaschools.org
3. Only your MATH class as been rolled over to your new grade and content.

NEW STUDENTS: Create an account.

1. Go to [khanacademy.org](https://www.khanacademy.org)
2. Click on **SIGN UP** in the top right hand corner. Enter **Code** below first. Then click on **Create an Account**.
3. Enter your **Date of Birth**. Continue with Google using your example@phcaschools.org email that will be issued to you.

ONCE LOGGED IN

- Your **Math Class** will appear on the left side of your screen (i.e. **06 MATH PHCA 26/27**) and the center will show your summer studies assignments under "My Assignments".
- Attempt all assignments and try to score **70%** or more. You will be graded on completion of all your assignments.

9TH & 10TH Grade:

Read the book of **Acts**. Choose a person from the book that you either liked or disliked and answer the following questions: Why did God choose to tell his or her story in the Bible? How do you think this character's story adds to the Big story of Scripture? How did this character's view on God and the World affect their decisions and choices? How does the story of this character paint a picture or point to the greater redemption and salvation we have in Jesus?

Write a Character Analysis based on the character you select. This will be an **EIGHT-PARAGRAPH** essay.

1. Paragraph 1: **Introduction**. Capture the reader with a strong introduction. Provide the general theme of the book of John. Introduce the person you chose and present your thesis statement.
2. Paragraphs 2-7. **Body**. These paragraphs should attempt to provide insight to the **FIVE QUESTIONS** provided above regarding the person you have chosen. Provide details from the text to support your responses.
3. Paragraph 8. **Conclusion**. Bring your writing to a close and sum up everything. Provide insight as well on why having a biblical worldview is important and how this worldview should influence you (or Christians in general).

11TH & 12TH Grade:

Read the book of **John**. Pick a chapter from the book and write an expository essay. This will be a **7-10 PARAGRAPH** essay. Centralize your writing around two main points: a) How important is it to have a biblical worldview today as Christians to be able to combat the secular worldview; b) What was John's major intention in writing this book? What exhortations, encouragements, and/or warnings are outlined within John that we as Christians should heed?

1. Paragraph 1: **Introduction**. Capture the reader with a strong introduction. Provide the general theme of the book of John. Introduce the person you chose and present your thesis statement.
2. Paragraphs 2-6. **Body**. These paragraphs should attempt to provide insight to the **TWO MAIN POINTS** provided above. Provide details from the text to support your responses.
3. Paragraph 7. **Conclusion**. Bring your writing to a close and sum up everything.
