



What boundless love, what fathomless grace You have shown us, O God of compassion! Each day we live, an off ring of praise As we show to the world Your compassion.





Weekly Prayer Focus

They are grateful that the skies are peaceful again and that they can concentrate on language acquisition and the new baby due this fall. They are reaching their goals in learning Arabic and have enrolled in a Christian language center to focus on higher level vocabulary. Also, they enjoyed their family conference in Cyprus last month, finding profound encouragement in the presence of the Lord. Please pray for Katie's last trimester, for a smooth delivery, and a healthy mom and baby. For the boys, pray for Aidan's new preschool and their adjustment to a new baby in the months ahead. Pray also for the Lord's open door as they decide on what ministry opportunities will be best for their second term in training.

Mission Memphis–Local Partners: Praise God for our local ministry partners serving throughout Memphis.
