#### **HEAR** the Word

"Open my eyes, that I might behold wonderous things out of your law."
-Psalm 119:18

- 1. How does Paul's introduction of himself fit the context of what he will write and to whom he is writing?
- 2. What are some of the reasons it was so important for Paul to begin the letter with this long introduction?

### **PRACTICE the Word**

"...Everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock."

-Matthew 7:24

- 1. What goes through your mind when you hear Paul calling himself a "servant (literally "slave") of Jesus Christ? Is that just for Apostles and pastors or is it for all Christians? What are the implications of that?
- 2. Why does Paul address both the humanity and deity of Jesus? Why is that so important to the truth of the Gospel?
- 3. How does Paul's description of the Roman Christians encourage you personally?

#### **RETELL the Word**

"Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you..."
-Mark 5:19
